"BABY KILLER: Fired For Immorality" is the outrageous, true story of Marie Bain, told through song, dance, and multiple characters, of her involvement with the Catholic church, Planned Parenthood, and the 1st Amendment.

In this documentary, Bain plays 34 people and characters as she relates, with emails, blogs, and newspaper articles, (punctuated with musical interludes), the events that led to and through her hiring, firing, and lawsuit against the school, the Catholic Diocese of Sacramento, and the bishop.

For those not familiar with her story, the online web site womensenews.org reports (tinyurl.com/6e3yyh): "Drama teacher Marie Bain was fired from a Catholic school system in Sacramento, Calif., in 2005 when an anti-abortion activist and parent complained that Bain had been an escort at a Planned Parenthood clinic before teaching at the school."

Religion, Culture, History, and Mankind's Survival on Earth By Paul Storey

I began to have doubts about religion in high school. After studying mythology, Catholicism began to look like another step in the progression of ideas which echoed mankind's primitive understanding of the world. Early societies had gods of the hunt, fertility, love, war, the harvest. These morphed into Egyptian gods half animal, half human. The Romans and Greeks transformed their deities into human form, with gods who played chess with the lives of men. These gods were immortal, but could be deceived, and were all too human in their emotions, including lust for mortal women.

The Hebrews made their god more abstract, without a face, without form, and increased his power and knowledge to infinity. With the lure to the masses of immortality in heaven and fear of hell, Christianity dominated society, bringing the dark ages. With the church ruling the state came the horrors of the Inquisition. Islamic states today still resemble this period of theocracy.

Brave men struggled against the power of the church, risking their lives in defying dogma and Holy Scripture in declaring the earth was not the center of the universe. Over hundreds of years, science progressed and the dominion of religion steadily diminished. New inventions which prevented the wrath of god's punishment, such as lighting rods on buildings and smallpox vaccines, became accepted. Anesthesia was used during birth, eliminating god's punishment to all the descendants of Eve.

Darwin finally drove the final nail in the coffin, eliminating the need for a divine source of life. The religious opposition to this discovery still blazes today.

Contrary to Biblical times, polygamy was banned, slaves were freed and women became legally equal to men. Morality and ethics were being driven by human enlightenment, not by ancient scripture.

Birth control was condemned as a mortal sin by the Pope, not once, but in two Encyclicals. As if breeding in exponential growth until all resources are exhausted, like bacteria in a Petri dish, was god's intention for mankind. The Pope can never change his mind, because that would show Popes to be fallible! So we are locked into overpopulation and ever diminishing resources, leading to starvation, famine, disease and wars over resources such as land, oil, then food and water. 

"I did nothing that broke any law. I did nothing illegal. I did nothing. All it takes is one fanatic," said Bain. "It knocked my life into a tailspin."

Since that time, the court system awarded Ms. Bain a settlement.

Historical Figures Series From Undine, by Olive Schreiner By Ken Nahigian

A while back, quite a while, I wrote of Olive Emilie Albertina Schreiner, the little-known Victorian feminist and freethinker, and a personal favorite writer. Time to revisit. Here follows an excerpt from her novel, Undine, published 1928.

Found with her personal papers, Undine is a metaphor for Schreiner's own life, her closest effort at an autobiography and a good introduction to her. 10-year old Undine is the main character. Here she and her classmates receive their Sunday lessons; the subject: Matthew's Gospel, chapter twenty-five. The instructor speaks.

"What does the thirty-first verse speak of, my dear?"

"The judgment of the world," said Undine.

"And what does he say to the good people on his right and the bad on his left hand?"

"He says to the good people, 'Come, you blessed, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world'; and to the others, 'Go, you cursed, into the everlasting fire'."

"And what lesson does this teach us, my dear?"

"That God has prepared a heaven for the people he means to save and a hell for the people he means to burn," said Undine, very gravely, never raising her eyes from the carpet on which they rested.

There was a pause; then came the remark: "Hardly the right way of putting it, my dear. It teaches you that you should be a very good little girl, so that when you die God may take you to heaven and not send you to hell to burn forever and ever." "I would much sooner be wicked and go to hell than be good only because I was afraid of going there," said Undine, now raising her eyes from the carpet and fixing them on the horrorstricken countenance of her instructress.

"Undine!" gasped forth that unfortunate individual. "Undine, what do you mean? You were always an evil and wicked child, but you grow viler every day."

"Yes," said Undine, getting off the box, with a face alternately as red as

the sprigs on her little print dress and as pale as her little white pinafore--"yes, I don't want to go to heaven, and, if God wants to, he can send me to hell and I will never again ask him not to, never. I know I'm very wicked, but I'm not half so wicked or so cruel as he is. Nothing is, not even the devil. The devil is glad when we go to hell, but he did not make us on purpose to send us there, and he did not make hell, and he did not make himself, and I'm sorry for him. I believe he tries to be good and God won't let him, that's what I believe," said Undine, who, with her wild dark eyes and clenched hands, looked more like some spirit who had just arrived from the regions of which she spoke than a carefully-brought-up little Christian receiving her Sunday lesson.

If she had been Medusa her gaze could not more completely have paralyzed her opponent, who sat there as if turned into stone; while the two little pudding-faces looked from one to the other with wild astonishment in their big grey eyes.


Undine clasped her little hands behind her and walked slowly out of the room.

It was the first time that she had ever given utterance to the evil thoughts with which her small and, as she believed, devil-ridden soul was haunted; they were fiendishly evil thoughts, all of them, she knew; but, if they were hers, why should she not give them utterance?

Her little heart swelled so it well nigh suffocated her, but it was with a sense of freedom and strength that she was pacing up and down her little room, when she heard the key turn in the door.

It was pleasant enough to think of having a day all to herself with no fear of interruption and no company but her books; but to think of that clink of the key and know that, wishing it or not, she was a prisoner, made her stamp her feet upon the ground as she walked up and down and to rebel in her bitter little heart against all powers, human and divine.
