Leo Igwe, humanist, human rights activist and past director of the Nigerian Humanist Movement, has worked tirelessly to end human rights violations and cruelties in Africa, including homophobia, ritual killings, human sacrifice, hysteria about sorcery and witchcraft, abuse of albinos, caste discrimination, anti-blasphemy laws, and "child witch" pogroms that have caused abuse, abandonment and murder of children. He has been arrested and his family persecuted for his humanist activism. An eloquent and well-spoken humanist, he is perhaps the most prolific writer in the world on atheism and humanism with respect to these human rights violations, and has been praised as an advocate for justice and the value of human life. Leo has agreed to tell us of his work on his way to another presentation. To host him is a rare and distinct honor. Don't miss this amazing talk!



Katherine Stewart: The Good News Club

"Give us a child until he is seven," the Jesuits famously said, "and we will have him the rest of his life." As <u>Katherine Stewart</u> found, evangelical Protestents have torn this leaf from the Jesuit book, focusing missionary efforts on children who are easy to intimidate and lack critical thinking skills. In 2009 a group called "The Good News Club" tried to set up a so-called "nondenominational Bible study" group at her daughter's grade school. In fact, the "Club" was a program of CEF, the Child Evangelism Fellowship, with a disengenuous and deeply fundamentalist agenda. These 'Clubs' exist in public schools across the nation; few escape their attention. Sophisticated stealth tactics bamboozle them (and their parents) into thinking the Clubs operate under color of school authority -- but in fact, the ultimate goal of the CEF is to shut down the public school system.
