
"Survey of Pseudoscience" A Skeptics Panel—Sept. 9



Whence Cometh Our Morality?

Spend 17 minutes. Watch Frans de Waal's video, "Moral Behavior in Animals": http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Gc|xRqTs5nk

Promoting morality through emotional and social intelligence is a priority for AOF. Frans de Waal is a primatologist, ethologist, and author who focuses on the evolution of morality and social altruism. His books include *Primates and Philosophers: How Morality Evolved*, *Your Inner Ape*, and a new book, *The Bonobo and the Atheist*, coming out in March 2013.

Empathy, cooperation, fairness and reciprocity -- caring about the well-being of others seems like a very human trait. But Frans de Waal shares some surprising videos of behavioral tests, on primates and other mammals, that show how many of these moral traits all of us share. You'll enjoy the 17 minutes of his TED Conference talk on YouTube, where he demonstrates the traits most people think of as oh, so human, yet displayed clearly in other species.

This photo, from his video, shows one monkey upset that his neighbor is getting a better treat though he did not do the work. This monkey was just fine previously when the other monkey was only given substandard treats. Sense of fairness?



Here we see two monkeys working together to both pull ropes to bring in a box containing

treats. You will see how the hungry monkey prods the well-fed monkey into helping, even though only one of them is really interested in the reward. Goodwill? Cooperation? Brownie points?

This photo is one of many where we see another species displaying consoling behavior. In the video you will see a child monkey come over to console an adult who has just lost a fight and is sulking. This is unmistakably a display of empathy and compassion.



Next time a believer asks you how you can have morals without God or their Scriptures, tell them it's evolution. We are hard-wired with morality.

Leo Igwe: Human Rights Abuses in Africa

No one who hears <u>Leo Igwe</u> speak would doubt that he is a passionate man. The fifty or so people who attended this meeting can testify to that.

Mr. Igwe's presentation was about human rights abuses in Africa. Having been born and educated in Nigeria, he naturally focused primarily on that nation while making it clear that several other countries in the region share the problem.

And the problem is that superstition encourages ritual sacrifice of human beings, mainly older women and children, the easiest targets of opportunity. Children are sacrificed in the belief that their body parts will bring luck or good health to someone. Women and children are murdered because someone accuses them of witchcraft. Sadly, even organized religions such as Christianity and Islam do not prevent these atrocities, but in fact either ignore or encourage them. And the governments seem helpless to stop them.

Then there's the internecine warfare in Nigeria between the predominantly Muslim North and mainly Christian South. It seems that religion and other forms of superstition are a curse upon the nation of Nigeria.

This is where Mr. Igwe comes in: He is a humanist and human rights activist, he has been executive director of the Nigerian Humanist Movement, director of the Center for Inquiry Nigeria, the Western and Southern African representative to the International Humanist and Ethical Union, and currently serves on the Atheist Alliance International Council. At great personal risk due to the acrimony his activities arouse in the superstitious, he speaks out against all forms of irrational, harmful behavior in his country and on the continent. He has even taken a stand against gender discrimination in the law, a hot-button issue in much of Africa.

Thank you, Leo Igwe, for your inspiring presentation. I'm sure all of us in that room came away richer in understanding and empathy for the oppressed, because of your work.

"Dear Mynga, I am writing to thank you and other friends at AOF, for inviting me to address you during my first visit to the US. The meeting left very deep impressions and on me and I will continue to recall the experiences for some time to come. When I started the local humanist group in the 90s, I never thought that a day like that would come when I would meet with friends in your own part of the world. Even as I am doing this mail it still appears to me as if all that was a dream. I was excited by the warm, friendship and hospitality extended to me during my stay. I was greatly inspired by the support and understanding of friends. Particularly that many people appreciated challenges and situations that were different from what they were used to. I will always cherish their encouragement and continue to draw strength from it. Thank you once again. In appreciation, Leo"


