Introducing "Ask The Social I.Q. Lady"

Being an atheist in today's world can be very challenging. Atheists are viewed as the least trusted group around. We're considered worse than common criminals. And what is our crime? Our lack of belief.

Since "coming out" in my early 20s, I have learned a lot about interacting with believers. Some of it has been very good, and some has been heartbreaking. I have taken what I've learned and put it to good use helping other atheists like you communicate more effectively by raising their social intelligence.

Social Intelligence affects every one of our relationships. When we realize how much we're all connected to each other and how those relationships affect us, we stop thinking about ourselves as autonomous beings. Instead we start focusing on the feelings and connections we have with each other. We not only have to understand ourselves and how we come across to others but we also have to be able to quickly grasp body language, intonation, and subtleties of speech in order to deal most effectively with people.

Mysticism is an epistemological disease that affects everyone. It progressively undermines one's capacity to think. Social Intelligence helps us identify how mysticism works by recognizing dishonest communication, out-of-context assertions or attacks, and use of non sequiturs. I will show you how to think critically and combat superstition, religion and ignorance all with a grace and style that keeps you in control.

Bill to Create Darwin Day in House Committee


Representative Rush Holt of New Jersey introduced to the House a bill called "Expressing support for designation of February 12, 2013, as Darwin Day and recognizing the importance of science in the betterment of humanity."

This bill, with five co-sponsors, has been sent to the House Committee on Science, Space and Technology. Part reads, "Whereas Charles Darwin is a worthy symbol of scientific advancement on which to focus and around which to build a global celebration of science and humanity intended to promote a common bond among all of Earth's peoples. ... Resolved, That the House of Representatives--

- (1) supports the designation of Darwin Day; and
- (2) recognizes Charles Darwin as a worthy symbol on which to celebrate the achievements of reason, science, and the advancement of human knowledge."

Skeptic's Corner—The Amazing Randi's Life on Film

How easily we are fooled. James Randi, known as "The Amazing Randi" as a magician, is now our nation's greatest debunker of the paranormal. Why did he leave his top status as a famed magician? Deceivers who conned the public, claiming their tricks were supernatural, often sweeping tons of cash from grieving or gullible people, has led Randi in his later years to call hoaxers on their tricks.



He has appeared on national television, often duplicating the so-called mystical tricks that other guests had just done to impress the audiences. He can replicate all those séance writings and manifestations. He can make you think ghosts are in the room, or that he can read your mind, or speak with the dead. But, unlike those he debunks, he will always tell you he is using tricks.

Now his life story, as amazing as his magic, is told on the big screen. Through Kickstarter, producers raised \$148,000 toward finishing the film. They have spent two years with Randi, interviewed and watched him, collected amazing stories. If you can help them (they went to their second goal of raising another \$100k as of this

Benediction Hurtful to Atheists—Did anyone notice?

The following Letter to the Editor was published January 22 in the Sacramento Bee, following the President's Inauguration:

"I try to do good. I volunteer a lot. I give money to those I love and those I don't even know.

"I am a good, moral friend, neighbor and relative. But the benediction at the president's inauguration hurt me.

"Rev. Luis Leon said, 'We pray that you will bless us with your continued presence because without it, hatred and arrogance will infect our hearts. But with your blessing we know that we can break down the walls that separate us. We pray for your blessing today



because without it, distrust, prejudice and rancor will rule our hearts ... We pray for your blessing because without it suspicion, despair, and fear of those different from us will be our rule of life.' He went on further, too.

"That benediction painted anyone not 'blessed' by or seeking the speaker's god as greedy, corrupt, intolerant, war-minded and hateful. Words used for his fellow believers were all about love, unity and inclusion.

"You know, where I see hatred and divisiveness is from those most holding to a religion. Where I see morality, love and tolerance is from those who know what is right in their hearts. Did he get his lists mixed up?

"Stop painting atheists as immoral. We do good because it is right. Stop hurting us with your divisive words, please." [The Letter to the Editor of the Bee ends here.]

... We need to speak up, fellow freethinkers, every time we see an injustice like this, we need to voice our position. Just look at the President's head bowed, dig-




nifying these divisive words with his silence. Others shown in camera shots during this prayer were seen nodding in agreement. How painful would it be if the prayer spoke such horrible words about any other group, say, a certain race or those who are short, or left-handed people? We can't let our silence condone this. Speak up, every time this happens. Be heard. It matters.




Here you see Walt posing in the fun Norman Rockwell scene set up at the Crocker Art Museum for the exhibit about this great American illustrator and artist.


