"Ask The Social I.Q. Lady"

Dear Social I.Q. Lady,

I would think atheists would be better at not falling victim to scams, but I have atheist friends that still got taken. What's a good way to avoid becoming a dupe? Trevor

Dear Trevor,

Yes, it happens to the best of us. We fail to recognize the signs. We let our veil of skepticism part and walk right into the arms of a scam. Fortunately, we can learn from our mistakes and the failings of others to avoid any future blunders.

The three keys to help you avoid becoming a victim of a scam are: negotiating skills, a moral compass, and common sense. Good negotiating skills include having the power to walk away from a "deal", being able to observe (watch and listen), being prepared (gathering pertinent information and checking all the facts), and patience. Patience is important because scammers frequently use the "sense of urgency" on their victims to get them to act quickly before they come to their senses

We all need a moral compass. It's that "inner voice" that alerts us to what is right and what is wrong. If your moral compass is confounded by greed, you're more likely to buy into a scam. Someone once said, "It's the set of the sails and not the gales that determine your direction."

If something is too good to be true, it probably is. Use your common sense to "smell" a rotten egg. Be skeptical. We are very good at seeing what we want to see. Don't forget to look for what you don't want to see.

Anyone can be a victim. Use your brain and think. When in doubt, ask a skeptical friend to take a look at the "deal". Your friend will not be emotionally involved and can offer a fresh perspective.





Homeopathy - Homeo-Pathetic, More Accurately

Review: Alzheimer's Talk with Mynga Futrell

Speaking without access to her PowerPoint presentation -- due to a computer malfunction -- Mynga Futrell nevertheless gave a riveting talk on the subject of Alzheimer's disease. Titled "Heartache and Hope: A Look at Alzheimer's Disease," her speech was a perfect mixture of startling statistics and moving personal stories.

After saying that Alzheimer's is only one form of dementia, she explained that it represents the largest subset of that umbrella term. Furthermore, she pointed out that Alzheimer's is the number six cause of death, and the numbers are growing due to the aging of the Boomer generation. But research into this devastating affliction is funded at about \$500 million, a fraction of what is budgeted each year for other major diseases.

There is no cure for the disease, although there are drugs to help the patient cope. Diagnosis is now possible without awaiting autopsy, thanks to brain scanning techniques which have recently become available. There also is more help for the primary caregiver than in decades past: day care, home care, assisted living facilities all can provide relief.

And the caregiver -- usually a spouse or other family member -- really needs help! Ms. Futrell stressed that caring for a dementia patient is far, far more difficult than caring for a patient suffering from another type of affliction.

Although she provided much more information in her talk, Ms. Futrell very much wants people to consider volunteering with the Alzheimer's Association, as she has. She said that group needs all forms of assistance. If we are at all interested we should check out www.alz.org for more information.

Thank you, Mynga Futrell, for your very excellent presentation. We were all moved and informed by it.



The Inverted World of Cyrus Teed

You know the Flat Earth Society, of course: the watchdogs and insurgents against atheistic round-earth cosmology. Its history goes back to 1849. The last major flat-earth spokesman, Rev. Charles K. Johnson, died in March 2001. The Society may or may not still exist—no one seems sure. It is or was one of my favorite movements. Not my most favorite, however. Listen.



Suppose that the world is not flat but spherical, and hollow. Suppose we live on the concave surface within, like bacteria on a beach ball's interior; planets, stars and wheeling constellations all afloat in the enclosed space, the farthest mere dustmotes only 4000 miles away—and the true external universe (under our feet) solid matter going out forever—what then? Such was the inverted view of Cyrus Teed, an eccentric doctor (herbalist, actually) from upstate New York.

In 1869, Cyrus had a vision: a beautiful woman appeared and explained to him the true, divine form of the world. Taking the name Koresh (do not confuse, please, with David Koresh of Waco), he published The Cellular Cosmology, his opus magnum, where he eagerly explained Earth's concavity. "All that is opposed to Koreshanity is antichrist," proclaimed the new prophet.

The sun is in the center. Dark on one side, it turns; this explains day and night. Tricks of optics produce the illusions of sunrise, sunset and

a horizon, and also prevent us from seeing the antipodal continents directly above. The moon is some kind of weird reflection of the Earth (Koresh was sure he could see outlines of the continents on it).

Besides astronomy and geology, he also denounced the scientific method, Copernican theory, atomic theory, chemistry, conventional surveying, and of course optics. Everything you know is not just wrong, it is damn wrong.

Koresh toured and preached. He founded a communal society in Chicago, the Koreshan Unity, a periodical, The Flaming Sword, and eventually a political party (no, not the libertarians, shut up). At its height, "Koreshanity" had several thousand followers. In the 1890s he established the town of Estero in Florida, near Ft. Meyers, declaring it the coming capital of the world. He expected eight million settlers. ... Only 250 came.

Koresh also taught that after his death he would rise to heaven, taking his faithful followers with him.

Alas, he died in 1908, and eventually county health officers forced the colony to bury the decaying body. They placed it in a tomb, which a 1921 hurricane washed out to sea. The Flaming Sword continued to publish until 1949. It never admitted the divine leader was gone.

Followers hung on for a while, but now they are sadly gone, too. Florida preserves the main colony as a historic site in Estero.

You'd Never Fall For This, Right?



A British businessman who sold the Iraqi security forces more than 6,000 fake bomb detectors bought from the United States was convicted of fraud. The device has a lengthy piece of metal that freely swings as you tilt it. It was supposed to swing to the side if it detected the item of interest. McCormick sold the devices for up to \$40,000 each. The fake detectors were purchased by the Iraqi government and used at checkpoints throughout the country, as well as in Mexico, Syria, Lebanon and Niger. McCormick faces up to eight years in prison for selling this swivel.

Magnetic Man. People commonly stick smooth objects to their oily skin claiming special powers. (Try that when you're wearing a shirt.) "I defeated the similar claims of a Chinese gentleman who even stuck a porcelain toilet lid to his own son's chest to prove how magnetic his whole family was. I dusted father and son with talcum powder, and their powers evaporated." (James Randi)





At a humble medical clinic in LA, lined with messages of Christian inspiration, patients flocked to see Dr. Christine Daniel. Few knew that the physician and ordained minister at Sonrise Medical Clinic faced up to 150 years behind bars and a \$5.5 million fine after being convicted of federal fraud charges for bilking desperate cancer sufferers of their money, claiming she could cure them with something she whipped up herself. "She's terrific. She's fantastic. And she's *Christian*," said Alicia Wolfkill, 33, of Mission Hills.



The Woman Who Could Not Be Lifted. Here's the trick: Keep yourself at least a foot away by placing your hands on their upper arms. Similar fake tricks are used to promote those "Power Balance Bracelets" which are no more than plastic. Tiny drilled holes were found where the oil had been injected so it could seep out slowly. Even after discovery of the hoax people still insisted it was a genuine bleeding statue caused by God. The church profited quite well. Another famous weeping statue was found to be "natural" - in that the tears actually came from a leaky plumbing line from the bathrooms above. That discovery was not well taken. "I don't care (about the report)," one parishioner said. "With my eyes I saw that. I believe it in my heart. It's a miracle. No one knows what happened, but it's a sign from God."

Guardian Angel Saves Man, Caught in Actual Photograph! Is it a miracle he survived? Is this angel responsible? This picture with accompanying story of survival is a complete fabrication using Photoshop and an actual accident that can be verified (for authenticity). First posted on a faith-based site, it gained a list of comments claiming confirmation, and was reposted repeatedly before it was revealed that the image was a hoax. These photoshopped hoaxes were generated by Matt Martin for Sacramento Reason.





Angels Seen in Skies Around the World as New Pope is Elected! More accurately, our photographer, Matt Martin, found an image of an angel, blurred it and blended it into a cloudy sky to produce a compelling "sign". (See original image in corner of photo.) Thanks, Matt, for showing us how easy it is to make a hoax that goes viral.



A Real Mermaid! Come See the Proof! This made PT Barnum famous. The creature was allegedly caught in 1842 by a "Dr. J. Griffin." Griffin was actually Levi Lyman, one of Barnum's close associates. Though many people believed Barnum's claim, the Fiji mermaid was actually the torso and head of a baby monkey sewn to the back half of a fish and covered in papier-mâché. People flocked to see it.



Our brains are story-tellers. The person able to second-guess the confirming bias of their own brain's insistent stories is a laudable freethinker, indeed.



Susan Mogull

Susan L. Stalnaker was born in 1942 and raised in Weston, W. Va. She graduated from a state college and

earned a master's degree in English from West Virginia University. She taught English and American history at elementary schools in Maryland and at Glenville State College in West Virginia before marrying Bob Mogull in 1970. She moved to Sacramento with her husband, a long-time business professor at California State University, Sacramento, and raised three children.

Susan L. Mogull, a teacher and influential advocate for accurate portrayals of Jews and Judaism in education, died April 24 of cancer, her family said. She was 72.

Raised Methodist in West Virginia, Mrs. Mogull was a schoolteacher in the South before she converted to Judaism, married and settled in the Sacramento area. Her unassuming personality and soft approach to people contrasted with her firm beliefs and leadership as a champion for balanced and accurate treatment of Jewish people, heritage and history in public schools.

She co-founded the Institute for Curriculum Services, a national resource center that provides schools with materials about Jews, Judaism and Israel. She reviewed textbooks on California Department of Education advisory panels and testified before state officials on textbooks and the treatment of religious minorities in education.

She was instrumental in a State Board of Education decision to require changes in a textbook that spelled the Christian God with a capital "G" but the Jewish God with a lower-case "g." She helped persuade a publisher to revise a sixth-grade history book that contained many errors, including a suggestion that Jews — not the Romans — killed Jesus.

While opposing teaching religion in public education, Mrs. Mogull supported teaching about religion in appropriate subjects and grade levels. As founder and president of the Sacramento chapter of Americans United for the Separation of Church and State, she helped persuade California officials to adopt constitutional guidelines for teachers to discuss religion with neutrality and objectivity.

"The basic principle that Susan felt so strongly about is that religion thrives when government stays out of their business, and legislation should never be based on people's religious preferences," said Carol Velarde of Americans United for Separation of Church and State.

She received the Earl Raab Award from the Jewish Public Affairs Committee of California for service to the statewide Jewish community.

"I had no idea I was marrying such an activist," her husband said. "She was such a nice, easy girl to live with, and in 42 years we never argued – and here she was this dynamo, this bulldog in her activities. She was such a gentle woman."

Survived by: Husband, Bob of Elk Grove; children, Robin Levingston of Peoria, Ariz., Scott of Austin, Texas, and Michael of Atascadero; sister, Amanda Lilly of Virginia; three grandchildren.
