"Ask The Social I.Q. Lady"

Dear Social I.Q. Lady,

It seems whenever I get into a discussion with my relatives about religion, it turns into a fight. I want to be able to visit and sometimes talk about religion without feeling like I've just returned from war. Any suggestions? -- Beverly

Dear Beverly,

Conflict can be agonizing. The kind of conflict to which you're referring is called "intergroup" conflict. The conflict rises to a higher level because it's more complicated, involves more people and includes centuries of history. It could involve warring nations just as easily as feuding families. Religion is one of those areas where groups become entrenched in their argument and often use "representatives" to help form their opinions in the matter. With religion, it can be the Pope, local minister, rabbi, or other spiritual leader. In this way, you are not only "negotiating" with one or two family members, you're also taking on their religious leader.

Here are some Practical Tips to maintain your cool during conflict:


- I. Pick your battles. Don't argue over everything.
- 2. Develop a reputation as someone who admits when you are wrong.
- 3. Provide an alternative for ideas you oppose. Don't knock down the ideas of others without having something else to suggest.
- 4. Let the other person speak first. This will encourage the other person to listen better. You will also gain insight into what it takes to satisfy him or her.
- 5. Base your statements on facts. Avoid exaggeration.
- 6. Don't lose your temper.
- 7. Avoid sarcasm, disbelief, and caustic humor.
- 8. Develop a win-win mentality. Aim to meet both your needs and the other person's. Avoid simply trying to defend your position. Never try to win by destroying the other person.

Not many ever changed their mind about religion from being berated. Hope this helps!



Camp Quest is a week-long summer camp for children in non-religious families. The curriculum focuses on science, skepticism, Humanism, teamwork, and nature. Children are taught how to think critically about the world around



them. It is also a safe place for children, free of proselytizing and bullying from others and welcoming to exploration and critical thought.



Dear His Holiness, Pope Francis:

As the Executive Director of the Secular Coalition for America (SCA), I am given the responsibility of representing all nontheists in America, which includes atheists. Our numbers are very much on the rise and those not affiliated with religion now constitute 20% of America's population and nearly 40% for those under 30 years old. The SCA looks to unify this community and facilitate coordination between all the national nontheist groups (atheist, agnostics, freethinkers, etc.). In that spirit, I offer to meet with you, Pope Francis. When we meet, I hope we can start a dialogue based on tolerance and respect for both Catholics and atheists. For my part, I would like to discuss with you how Catholics and atheists can be respectful of each other, with neither side trying to force the other side to abide by its positions on matters of conscience. Perhaps you have particular items you would like to discuss as well.

Please let me know what date, time, and place you would like to meet. I look forward to meeting with you, Pope Francis, at your earliest convenience.

- Our own secular singing group, The Mockingbirds, are in high demand at many events (humorous secular and science lyrics)
- Atheist church called FACTS; all the trappings of church without the magic
- Workshop "How To Discuss Atheism" is well attended (part of dedication to on-going training)
- Monthly "Ancient Christian Study Group" has met for years.
- The very popular Earth Timeline, for a realistic perspective in science classrooms, comes from Brights Action, here in Sacramento

RECOGNITION OF SACRAMENTO'S SECULAR LEADERSHIP

- Hemant Mehta, The Friendly Atheist, says "Every major city with multiple freethought groups should put together something like this" referring to our one-of-a-kind area newsletter.
