

“Ask The Social I.Q. Lady”

As an atheist, I get very offended when someone asks me to pray for them or to join them in prayer. What can I say to get my point across? T.R.

Dear T.R.,

Remember, you are in complete control of how you allow others to make you feel. Why take offense over a question?

There are three parts of every good communication: oneself, the other person(s), and the situation. How you respond is going to depend on who the other person is (e.g.: family member, co-worker, stranger) and the circumstances. If a family member asks you to pray before a meal simply say, “Although I don’t pray, I do want to take this moment to show my gratitude.” Then either thank the cooks, the host or even the farmers who grew the food. If you’re not being asked, but happen to be part of the group, quietly step back and allow the others to do their thing.

Many believers will ask for prayer when someone is ill or needs help. What they’re really asking for is support. The relationship you have with that person will dictate your level of support. For example, if an acquaintance asks, you can respond with, “I hope (whomever) is going to be all right.” This way you’re showing support without addressing their petition. Those close to you should know your position on prayer, but oftentimes they don’t or they forget. If a close friend asks for your prayer, find out how you can be of real help. Say, “Let me help.” Then immediately follow that with suggestions that you are actually willing to do. “I can babysit” or “I can drop off a meal.” Sometimes it’s best just to show we care.





Secular Family Day in Stockton


Sunday, September 1, 12:00 - 5:00

Activist Corner By Julie Wedge

To pray or not to pray...that is the question. As atheists we feel there are many existing places for people to celebrate their faith. We also feel our government buildings are no place for that. We certainly have the Constitution on our side, but what happens when they think adding a little diversity makes it legal?

These thoughts are being played out now in Chico. Freedom From Religion Foundation (FFRF) and The Coalition of Reason recently challenged the Chico Council's invocation practice. Our Constitution states:

“Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.”

Clearly there is no establishment of a particular religion allowed, but they argue it allows religion over no religion. This is certainly what the Chico Council and other jurisdictions are using to justify it. But does that make it right? In the court of public opinion, most feel as long as a diversity of belief is recognized, or a particular deity is not mentioned, the wall of separation is not breached.

We disagree. Using any invocation separates believers from non-believers and therefore the wall is compromised. Some atheist groups have rallied around the Flying Spaghetti Monster (FSM) to see if their governmental agencies will truly recognize such diversity. And some actually do. We would like to suggest we continue to ask for invocations by followers of the FSM, or ask for a ban like Chico did with their petition found here:

If you are uncomfortable with this approach we would like to offer an alternative: Just ask your Council or government agency to put one day in the invocation rotation where they skip it altogether and just get to work!

Prayer Fails in Controlled Tests

“In the largest study of its kind, researchers found that having people pray for heart bypass surgery patients had no effect on their recovery. In fact, patients who knew they were being prayed for had a slightly higher rate of complications.” from [an article in NBC News](#) titled “Power of Prayer Flunks an Unusual Test.”

“The work, which followed about 1,800 patients at six medical centers, was financed by the Templeton Foundation, which supports research into science and religion.”

Similar tests have also failed: Byrd and Harris (1988), O’Laoire (1997), Sicher (1998), Mayo Clinic (2001), IVF-ET Prayer Scandal (2001), Rabin Medical Center (2001), MANTRA Study (2005) and STEP Project in 2006.

Lost at Sea Searching for God’s Will



Hannah Gastonguay, 26, told reporters that she and her husband had “decided to take a leap of faith and see where God led us.” They were lost at sea for weeks.

The family was eventually dropped off at the U.S. embassy in Chile, from which they will fly back to the states, courtesy of the same government that so seriously interfered with their religion, making them decide to leave in the first place.

Another Child Dies in Faith Healing Family

Herbert and Catherine Schai-ble stand charged with third-degree murder and other crimes after their 7-month-old son Brandon died from bacterial pneumonia, dehydration and a group B streptococcus infection on April 18.

Philadelphia District Attorney Seth Williams says the boy’s death could have been prevented, but the couple instead turned to prayer.


Richard Dawkins In Person October 7


