Atheism is at war to secure our intellectual freedom.



Legal Watch By Arash Khosrowshahi, Boalt Hall Juris Doctorate, 2013 [Congratulations on Passing the Bar, Arash!]

The Supreme Court heard arguments in *Town of Greece v. Galloway* on November 6. The legal issue presented is whether prayers at town board meetings violate the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment even in the absence of discrimination in the selection of prayer-givers and content. The text of the Establishment Clause, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion...", suggests that the answer is no, but Supreme Court precedents make the answer far from certain.

The famed Lemon test has lost much of its force in analyzing establishment issues in recent years. Justices Antonin Scalia and Clarence Thomas favor a coercion test, finding that prayers and invocations that fall below citizens feeling coerced into joining a religious ceremony are constitutionally permissible. Justice Scalia's also commented that society has determined that atheists and polytheists in particular are constitutionally excluded from this public tradition. There is also precedent in Marsh v. Chambers, which held that legislative prayers were constitutionally permissible as part of American history and tradition, which existed even when the First Amendment was ratified. This view found some skepticism from Chief Justice John Roberts and Justice Anthony Kennedy. Justices Elena Kagan, Sonia Sotomayor, and Stephen Breyer asked questions suggesting that government involvement in parsing which prayers were and were not sectarian was troublesome, as was people of minority faiths who felt excluded by not participating in prayers or by virtually not being represented by leaders of their own denominations, or who felt coerced into participating in order to receive favorable treatment by the board for their requests.

It appears the Court faces a choice between finding constitutionally permissible government involvement ensuring such prayers are nondenominational, or if that is unworkable, whether to disallow prayers altogether or allow any kind of prayer from anyone at town board meetings.

How the Court decides this issue will impact the limits of religious activity our local governments can participate in. As nonbelievers, we have the chance to affect grassroots change by taking such issues head on in our own communities if we feel there is an infringement of our rights. You can start by notifying your legislators and city council members, or at least let the local FFRF, ACLU and AU chapters know of any such praying happening locally.



For many of us atheists this holiday time is spent with family and friends, reflecting on the year together and enjoying the holiday spirit of warmth and giving. No war there.



Behind-the-Scenes Tidbits By Judy Saint

We were stopped dead by one designer who refused to do the project, so the billboard company had to hire a designer from their Fresno office. My billboard contact said, "Well, everyone is entitled to their beliefs." Except we aren't, I guess. Anyway, the company management took care of us.

One reporter kept going back to how offended people will be. I said it's probably more accurate that people will be surprised and shocked, and they interpret that as taking offense since they are unprepared to know what to feel about this. They have been the majority so long that this surprise will feel like they are being attacked and will put a sense of being offended upon themselves as their only way to identify the feeling. This was all quite an education for several of the reporters. Some, though, confided they're atheist. One wants to cover all the separation of church and state stories we can come up with.

There's a funny story about our "Pastafarian". It's a good thing I caught it in the proof set they sent me, and had them fix it. They thought it was a mistake, and had changed it to Rastafarian!

"Seriously, this is just so awesome ... I can't feel prouder of my community," from a Facebook comment. This is the highest goal I could ever have hoped for - that atheists would feel *pride* after hiding so long! My years of work come down to that one statement for me. After spending a long hour reading and replying to comments on the FOX NEWS article about our billboards, I have come to learn a few things:


- I) December belongs to Christians, because this is their holy month. No one else is allowed to talk until January. (This includes Jews, Muslims, etc.)
