Camp Quest West held a record-breaking summer camp this year! With the theme "Dragons, Dinosaurs, Discovery, and Discourse". Over 100 children and 35 adults took to Malakoff Diggins Park to learn about science, Humanism, and the beautiful California outdoors.

## **Coming Out**

"A Christian Holocaust is starting! Our freedom of speech is being restricted! Our faith has been spat upon and ignored! Our lives are in danger! Get your shotguns out and circle the wagons! Why? Because marriage equality is now the law of the land."



I knew my right wing fundamentalist friends and I saw things differently, but if you had told me before I saw it for myself that they would make these claims I wouldn't have believed you. I would have told you they are not that crazy. I would have been so wrong. They are completely batsh\*t.

I knew our country was polarized, it often feels like a civil war is about to erupt, only it would be waged in our own back yards as we are not segregated according to politics or religion. In many cases civil war is likely to break out in our living rooms.

Seeing this extremism can make coming out as a non-theist quite frightening, but feeling that fear reminds me of a quote by Elbert Hubbard my dad had taped to his desk for many years. "If you would escape moral and physical assassination, do nothing, say nothing, be nothing--court obscurity, for only in oblivion does safety lie."

I am not advocating that anyone be reckless and come out without giving the consequences serious thought. It's wise to be prepared to face whatever backlash may come. The rewards of coming out, however, are significant. It may be that it is your voice speaking reason that will break through the fear-based assumptions held by someone close to you, helping them realize that their rights are not trampled on when the rights that they have taken for granted for so long are extended to others. Come on out and speak up for reason!



You can see thousands more, rated from 100% down to 0%. Yes, they even name the baddies.

David Jacobs listened well to another member and took needed action: he rallied funders Alex Von Allman, Paul Story, Esther Franklin, Judy Saint and also David himself contributed financially so that a member could finally attend a much-needed Journey Free Recovery Retreat! The

Another sweet thing starting this June is the retired therapist Phil Lazier has offered to meet weekly with a small group to go deeper. Also he hopes to attend the larger monthly meetup. He used to help Viet Nam war veterans heal from PTSD.

We ask that attendees come only if they are currently working through the enormous challenge of healing from RTS. We ask that you respect the space as a place of healing. We have agreements for confidentiality: what's said in the group stays in the group. We agree not to share any names or words, or details of the meeting with anyone. You may not come out of nosiness. ## Juvenile Hall Update

For the first time ever, all the girls erupted in spontaneous applause at the end of our last Freethought Class at juvenile hall. Sometimes it's magical. Recent topics, for example, have been how people will avoid your good point by attacking you instead, extinct human species and evolution overview, and where morality really comes from (hint: it's not from religion). The girls asked if we would talk about ghosts, so that's what we covered in the next class—all the woo of astrology, palm reading and ghosts.

The girls love to look at photos and handouts that they can pass around the circle. At the previous class, Dee prepared a wonderful set of color photos of cute animals showing empathy and understanding of others' needs, in their own species and even across species. Some girls became quite engaged, nodding or even giggling at all the appropriate places, like when I teased Dee about making elephant noises for us. Then, of course, there are a few in some classes who generally keep their heads down, whether to keep from making eye contact or maybe their only way to show independence in a jail situation. Whatever the reason, I like to remember that they did press the button in their cell asking to be released to attend the class. That may be more telling than their demeanor in class. This is jail, after all.

We usually run past our 11:45 ending time, making sure the girls can ask questions privately if they want as they are returned to their cells. One girl, after class recently, spoke up with some eagerness to tell me what happened in bible class the previous Thursday. She recounted how the bible teacher told a story of god helping her through a math class that she knows she could not have passed on her own. The inmate telling me this then said she questioned the bible teacher, "Are you saying that you're too stupid to understand math?" She said the teacher affirmed, yes, she is too stupid to understand math. The girl telling me this couldn't believe anyone could be so ridiculous as to think that; to admit stupidity to that degree. She delighted in telling me how lame this bible teacher's response was to her. I saw two things here that I'm so proud of. One, this young girl felt free enough to question her bible teacher. Two, she appropriately saw the bible teacher's pride of stupidity as ridiculous. This class is working.

If you are an adult female interested in being on the list of leaders or co-leaders out there (Rancho Cordova area) let me know by emailing admin@sacramentoreason.org. You can co-lead this class one time to get the feel of it, and then you can apply for a permanent ID Badge if you care to join us again any time after that. Some leaders and co-leaders like visiting once a month, some prefer less often, or just to substitute when needed. Never any obligation. No skills necessary, just be yourself. Letting the girls know how to think for themselves is what they love to hear and what this class is about. This should be fun and fulfilling, not a stressor. Think about it. It means a lot to the girls. It will mean a lot to you.


cart, change their attitudes? Probably not. But we can put them back in the churches where they belong.



## Legal Watch By Arash Khosrowshahi

The Oklahoma Supreme Court ruled on June 30, 2015 that the Ten Commandments monument outside of the Oklahoma state capitol building be removed for violating Article 2, Section 5 of the Oklahoma Constitution.

Article 2, Section 5 reads as follows:

"No public money or property shall ever be appropriated, applied, donated, or used, directly or indirectly, for the use, benefit, or support of any sect, church, denomination, or system of religion, or for the use, benefit, or support of any priest, preacher, minister, or other religious teacher or dignitary, or sectarian institution as such."

Historically, Article 2, Section 5 was made part of the constitution when Oklahoma joined the Union because religious leaders of both Native American and Christian faiths feared government and politician interference with religion.

The court had reasoned that the plain meaning of the constitutional provision was that indirect use of public property in a broad sense was prohibited, and since the Ten Commandments monument is part of the Judeo-Christian faith tradition, its placement on public land was unconstitutional.

Importantly, the court made clear that it took no position on whether the monument violated the Establishment Clause of the United States Constitution, constraining itself only on the state constitutional issue. That said, the court did mention that some federal precedent exists for allowing such religious monuments on public land if for a non-religious historic purpose. Whether the defendants in this case wish to take the case to the United States Supreme Court to determine the federal issue has yet to be determined.

Importantly, this case puts an abrupt end to the Satanic monument that was also causing controversy in the state. Since the monument was proposed to be placed on the same capitol grounds in Oklahoma, it would likewise violate Article 2, Section 5.


