How did Socrates corrupt the youth? (He encouraged them to question everything.)

I am reading a book in which it seems the author has gone to great lengths to formulate a well-researched, and well-documented rational argument, to convince me that rational arguments don't convince people. I must admit, I'm not convinced.

I do understand this point to a degree though. When confronted with arguments that challenge firmly held beliefs people tend to become defensive, and possibly more deeply entrenched in the beliefs they hold and are comfortable with. The

objectives of rational arguments are typically to win a debate, persuade or to justify a given position. This approach does have its appropriate uses.

However, in more casual social interactions, regarding emotionally grounded and deeply held beliefs, rational dialog is likely more effective than rational argument. The objective of a rational dialog is to stimulate critical thinking rather than to persuade.

Last month Anthony Magnabosco gave an excellent presentation at the Reason Center about the importance or questioning believers. His method is grounded in Dr. Peter Boghossian's book <u>A Manual for Creating Atheists</u>. The methodology, known as <u>street epistemology</u> can be an effective means to talk to people about their deeply held beliefs. This methodology is the "Socratic Method", the method consistently employed by Socrates in the Platonic dialogs.

If you are looking for more effective ways to engage with people in dialogs related to religion, or other sensitive issues, I suggest you look into street epistemology, and check out Anthony's <u>YouTube Channel.</u> And, by all means read a view of Plato's Socratic dialogs.

I guess the downside of such an approach is that you may wind up challenging your own beliefs.
