# On Methodological Naturalism


Apologists argue that science and history are "methodologically naturalistic" because of an arbitrary philosophical bias. Why not accept at least the *possibility* of miracles? A miracle might be the most simple, economical explanation of the data! If you are unalterably opposed to supernatural explanations, you're a dogmatist.

But good reasons exist for methodological naturalism. It is not an arbitrary bias. Long ago, the Ionian philosopher Thales understood that it explains nothing if we piously claim that it rains because Zeus turned on the faucet. Even if God exists, as long as he is omnipotent and ineffable, uncircumscribed by testable rules, invoking Him short-circuits science. You get the same point in a famous cartoon, where a lab-coated scientist expounds his theory with a long equation on the chalkboard. In the middle of his scribblings is a gap and the words, "Here a miracle occurs." It is funny, for a reason apologists apparently do not understand.


To say that divine intervention "explains" something is tantamount to saying we just don't know. It's a tactic of desperation. One might want to resort to it when all else fails, as apologists think naturalistic explanations have failed. But then one has not found an "explanation" at all. Like the fundamentalists who say God must have ignited the Big Bang since scientists cannot yet say what caused it. Or like the child who says the TV works because magic elves are inside. It stifles further questions; it hobbles research.

Even if God exists, how is "God" ever an explanation? In most theologies, God is ineffable, a mystery. To claim one has "explained" a problem by invoking a mystery is no advance at all. You are just using a big enigma to explain a small one. "I have the answer to X! The answer is XX!"

The instant you invokes the divine-miracle wildcard, the game of science and scientific history comes crashing to an end. Reason is broken. Only belief remains.
