

<u>California Freethought Day</u>, in fact the <u>Sixteenth Annual Freethought Day Festival</u>, is a day when the state-wide community of freethinkers join hands to bring you a menagerie of wonders, an arabesque of dreams, a fabulous flight of free minds, and with it, music, tablers, speakers, and so much more ... really, you must be there to see. AOF began this event in 2002. Over the years it has grown, left the nest, and taken wing. We couldn't be more proud. (*sniff*).



California Freethought Day (CFD) is a public jubilee and gala, a celebration of secularism, a salute to independent and rational thought. It is open to everyone and free. It combines the fun and festivity of a fair with the education and activism of a conference. It features speakers, entertainers, food, prizes, a "family fun zone," vendors, exhibits, panels, art, and tons of fun.

Planners are packing the day with events to entertain you as much as uplift you. Projected speakers, panellists & entertainers will include Sikivu Hutchinson (African-American Feminist Author), Larry Decker (of the Secular Coalition for America), David Smalley (Podcaster and Activist), Jessica Xiao (Asian-American Feminist, Writer & Humanist), Elizabeth Lagesse (once arrested for Protesting), David Tamayo (President of Hispanic American Freethinkers), Athena Salman (Arizona State Representative), Melissa Pugh (United COR), Victor Harris (Poet), and even Uncle Sam, and many more. The line-up is probably growing as you read this.

So <u>sign up now</u>. Sign up *why?* It's free, isn't it? Indeed, the main event (Sunday) is free to attend, but advance registration (also free) makes you eligible for delightful & toothsome prizes. ➤ Philosophers' Table: Atheist, Secular or what? Sunday, October 29, 2017, 12 Noon - 1pm

"Atheism," we like to say, means without god. Just that. Not against god, that's "anti-theist." Assume we want atheism to be more visible. Rebrand it, scrape off the crust. Repeating the word loudly and often, will that do the trick?

It may not be wise to put ourselves at risk to rehabilitate a word. But this is *America*, dammit, where we're free to paint red targets on our t-shirts and run out on the Skeet Rage flapping our arms like twits. In fact, such behaviour is often admired (as long as it's you, not me, and I am standing well clear of the shrapnel). What might you gain, what might you lose?

People use words to frame issues and guide discussion. And "atheist" may not be the best. Let's consider what words are most effective in promoting a humanistic, secular point of view. (Hints: freethinker, humanist, secularist, bright, or ...?)

➤ Denis De Luchi: Fish Byne Yola, The Jew Who Saved Galileo Sunday, October 29, 2017, 1pm - 3pm

Now for something completely different! In this new work of historical fiction by AOF member Denis De Luchi, a Jewish man passing as Catholic is Galileo's lifelong pal. This man, Fishbeingla, takes it upon himself to protect the scientist from rival colleagues, enemies in the clergy, and the gutter rats of urban Italy hired to discredit and even harm Galileo. He risks danger and denouncement as a Jew to save Galileo's skin, meanwhile concealing his efforts so that the great man won't be distracted. Conflicts range from tavern debates to physical confrontations as various competitors and religious zealots take their pot-shots at both Galileo and Fishbeingla. The outcome is history. This is the secret story of how it came about.

Denis De Luchi is a retired Air Force Officer, Vietnam vet, former bomber pilot, and former project officer in Research and Development at a well-known company, where he worked in advanced missile guidance and satellite technology. After retirement he became a physics professor at various colleges and universities in the Sacramento region. He is the author of a dozen novels, many short stories, and books of poetry.



Book Review

Fish Byne Yola, The Jew Who Saved Galileo by Denis De Luchi (234 pgs, Jan 1971)

Fish Byne Yola, written by Denis De Luchi: This is a self-published book, but even a self-published book can benefit from a good editor. The title of the book Fish Byne Yola, *The Jew Who Saved Galileo* would lend one to believe that the main character's name was Fish Byne Yola, when it actually is Fishbeingnola. That aside, Denis De Luchi does provide an interesting romp through the Galileo time period with Fishbeingnola as our guide.








Fishbeingnola a self-described Jew, Catholic and atheist who says, "This business with religion has always annoyed me. As far as I could tell, everyone has a religion and most people have a Religion. The lower case is what one really believes and has taken on as a personal code. It is demonstrated in how one acts in daily life, from the trivial to the grandiose. It is driven by a person's conscience and dictates what he is allowed to do and what he should do. The upper case is driven by a person's need for guidance, rules, and a sense of belonging. It establishes the 'us', and makes possible a certain morality in a conflict with the 'them.' Both are personal, and should be kept that way. That is why I have never felt guilt in posing as a Catholic when I am really a Fishbeingnola. To discover whatever that is, one would have to follow me around for a year, taking copious notes, then let me know what the rules of my true religion are. Even then one might discover contradictions. I'm human."

It was Fisnbeingnola's humanness, or perhaps I should say hormones, that got Galileo introduced to a woman whom was being admired by a local low-life ruffian. A woman that Galileo, being more attuned to mathematics than hormones, would never have met on his own. Thus, beginning the cycle of Fishbeingnola's conscious need to save Galileo from the evils of the low-life ruffian that he, Fishbeingnola, started. Kind of shows when you meddle in someone else's life, you do pay for it, in more ways than one.

Luckily for us, this book is fiction; the low-life ruffian was killed, Galileo was saved. And not to poke fun at Fishbeingnola's name, but there is always a bigger Fish up the evolutionary chart, somewhere out in the Universe's Primordial Goo, always waiting to pounce on the lower-life forms below. Like I said it was an interesting romp.
