> Freethough Social Dinner


Sunday, Jan 13, 2019, 5pm








➤ Religious Freedom Day Wednesday, Jan 16, 2019

In the truest sense, Religious Freedom Day is both a religious and secular holiday. It marks the anniversary of the passage of the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom, the 1786 colonial statute that disestablished the Anglican Church in Virginia and set the foundation for Separation of Church and State. Thomas Jefferson marked it as one of his greatest achievements. Among other things it declared the following:





"that no man shall be compelled to frequent or support any religious worship, place, or ministry whatsoever, nor shall be enforced, restrained, molested, or burthened in his body or goods, nor shall otherwise suffer on account of his religious opinions or belief, but that all men shall be free to profess, and by argument to maintain, their opinions in matters of Religion, and that the same shall in no wise diminish, enlarge or affect their civil capacities."

Congress first marked Religious Freedom Day in 1993. It is a day to reflect on the hard-won separation of civic and religious life, and to refresh our resolve to inform fellow citizen about liberty of conscience in matters of faith, a liberty which must include both freedom of and from religion. Because otherwise, it is no freedom at all.

> Thomas Paine Day Tuesday, January 29, 2019

Thomas Paine Day, also called Freethinkers Day, promotes appreciation of freethought through the life and works of American patriot Thomas Paine. Paine (1737-1809) was a courageous freethinker whose life and work inspired great social and political advancement across world. Raised in England, Paine played a vital role in the American and French Revolutions. His books and pamphlets, including The Age of Reason, The Rights of Man, and Common Sense, gained a mass audience for the liberating philosophy of the Enlightenment.

Paine came to America in 1774 at Benjamin Franklin's request. On January 10, 1776, he published Common Sense, a remarkable and powerful republican pamphlet which had an immediate success. He served in the Revolutionary War under General Greene and later in official positions appointed by congress and in the Pennsylvania legislature. In his later publication, Age of Reason, Paine expressed that "all religions are in their nature mild and

benign" when not associated with political systems. Paine was the quintessential Deist of the 18th century.

In the 1990s, Truth Seeker magazine began celebrating Freethinkers Day on Thomas Paine's birthday in order to educate the public on the importance of Thomas Paine in the history of freedom. It's poetic description of the day is worthy to repeat:

This day honors Thomas Paine and is on his birthday, January 29. This is a global holiday and is simply celebrated by giving and displaying a White Rose with Thorns. The simple beauty and purity, the fragility and yet not without the danger of drawing blood by a thorn prick, makes this an excellent icon for those Freethinkers who want to reflect on Freedom and promote the ideas of personal liberty as expressed by Paine in The Declaration of Independence,

This is a holiday that celebrates the concept of Freedom by honoring the man who declared our Independence by giving us Common Sense and The Declaration. We owe a great debt of gratitude to Thomas Paine.

So, you are welcome to celebrate with us. Just remember a White Rose with Thorns.

The Thomas Paine Foundation also began celebrating the birthday of Thomas Paine on January 29th, a Thomas Paine Day proclamation on June 8 and other Paine theme events during the year.

➤ Gorilla Suit Day

Thursday, January 31, 2019

From the sublime to the ridiculous! Close after Tom Paine Day comes <u>National Gorilla Suit Day</u>, a pseudo-holiday invented by famed Mad Magazine cartoonist <u>Don Martin</u>. An effluvium of controversy continues to surround this celebration: to some it is a blatant conspiracy of gorilla suit manufacturers to promote



their wares, to others it is one of America's more important and venerable holidays. The origins lie in a 1963 comic strip. Don Martin aficionados evolved the tradition that "NGSD" falls on the last day of January each year.

Whatever your opinion of NGSD, few deny the cartooning genius of Don Martin. Art historian Charles Taylor described Martin's unique style of art and wit:

His people are big-nosed schmoes with sleepy eyes, puffs of wiry hair, and what appear to be life preservers under the waistline of their clothes. Their hands make delicate little mincing gestures and their strangely thin, elongated feet take a 90-degree turn at the toes as they step forward. Whether they're average Joes or headhunters, Martin's people share the same physique: a tottering tower of obloids. Martin puts the bodies of these characters through every kind of permutation, treating them as much like gadgets as the squirting flowers and joy buzzers that populate his gags: glass eyes pop out from a pat on the back; heads are steamrollered into manhole-cover shapes. All of this accompanied by a Dadaist panoply of sound effects found nowhere else: *shtoink! shklorp! fwoba-dap!* It's unlikely Samuel Beckett was aware of Don Martin, but had he been he might have recognized a kindred spirit.





Meet AOF's New Board Member

Last month's election results are in, and AOF has a new Director at Large! Former president of the Yuba Community College Secular Student Association and current leader of the CSUS Secular Student Alliance, Kaeleigh Pontif is a relatively new AOF member with boundless energy and an established track-record of leadership. Her biography says: "I was born and raised in Houma, Louisiana. As you can imagine, growing up in the southern bible belt has a certain set of challenges. The south takes cultural preservation very seriously, despite how archaic some of the traditions may

be. ... I graduated from H.L. Bourgeois High School in 2011, and moved to Marysville, California in 2013." Kaeleigh now studies Environmental Science at Sacramento State University, and is enthusiastic about helping AOF grow.



FFRF Holiday Display at the California Capitol

Once again, the Greater Sacramento Chapter of the Freedom From Religion Foundation (FFRF) raised a Capitol "nativity" depicting three Founding Fathers and the Statue of Liberty gazing at a "baby" Bill of Rights. A sign read: "At this Season of the Winter Solstice, join us in honoring the Bill of Rights, adopted on December 15, 1791, which reminds us there can be no religious freedom without the freedom to dissent." It ends: "Keep religion and government separate!" The nativity artist was Jacob Fortin.

FFRF raised the display as a response to a Christian nativity that went up again in Dec 2018, placed by the religion-promoting Thomas More Society. The display showcased the freethought perspective from Dec. 17 to Dec. 27.

"It is not cool to have such religious pageantry in the heart of state government," says FFRF Co-President Dan Barker. "If blatantly devotional exhibitionism is allowed in, there must be 'room at the inn' for our irreverence and freethought."

Kudos to the Greater Sacramento Chapter of FFRF, for helping bring a secular viewpoint before the residents of the Golden State.

As a professional violinist, I perform with various theaters, orchestras, and pro acts. Churches hire me quite a bit on Christmas and Easter. Mega-churches in Southern California are a gold mine – tons of money to spend on flashy electronics and amplified violins.

A few Easters ago, I was hired to be in the worship band. I am not a follower of these churches, but as a freelance musician I keep my mouth shut and act professional. This was one of those "under a huge tent" event where thousands of people showed up. Alter calls, tons of crying, tons of feeling like you are worthless without Jesus. The messages are totally scripted, and honestly, after many many years of being part of this organization, it was starting to grate on me.

In between one of the many services, a couple of 'prayer warriors' comes to the backstage area totally frantic. "Does anyone speak Japanese?!?!?" I am 100% fluent in Japanese. I grew up in the States but I spoke it at home with my parents. I slowly raise my hand, more for the sake of curiosity, and they whisk me away. I felt kinda gross at this point be the other Prayer Warriors (PW) are surrounding me clapping and praying out loud. It was cringey to say the least.

We stop running and I am face to face with two very meek looking Japanese teenage girls. They are obviously totally freaked out. I immediately start speaking to them, asking them how they are, names, etc. Basic introductory stuff. They were relieved that a Japanese woman came to their rescue! The aggressive PWs then tell me that these girls are "Ready to receive Christ as their Saviour!" One look and I knew that wasn't true. I asked them if they knew why they were here and they responded with "We were told this was going to be a going away picnic for us!" I asked them if they knew what Easter was and they had no clue. They were going back to Japan in a few days and they were completely confused bc they didn't know any of these people. They got roped into it bc their host family was one of the PWs.

The PWs were pushing me hard to translate the prayer to receive Christ forever. It was then I made a decision. They were asking me who these people are and after I told them this was a crazy church, they got even more scared. This is the conversation that went down:

PW: "I accept Jesus as my one and only savior. Please translate that."

Me: "Just keep looking down, I'll help you through this."

PW: "You have died for my sins and rose from the dead. I am nothing without you. Please translate that."

Me: "They will give you a bunch of books. Hang on to them, otherwise they'll be giving you more."

PW: "I invite Christ to guide me and (I don't remember the rest really...blah blah)."


Me: "Don't answer me but I think you said you go back to Japan on Tuesday. Just hang in there. These people won't hurt you, they are just a little weird."

PW: "fjdklafudisalgnfdjiaofudsklfjdkaldajkfduiao Jesus jdfkslajfdkslajfdksla, Amen"

Me: "We are about to end this - on my cue, just say Amen ... ok now:

Girls: "Ah-men"

Tons of clapping, tons of crying. These girls hugged me and thanked me. I never saw them after that. I know they were pretty much stuck all day be their host families were there all day.
