- 1. Open your Chrome web browser right now and install the Netflix Tele party Extension. Get it at: <a href="https://www.netflixparty.com/">https://www.netflixparty.com/</a>. (Really, do it *now*, don't wait till movie night!)
- 2. Just before show time, fire up the Chrome browser again and go to the very special Netflix Movie TeleParty link, which will appear on the AOF Website about a half hour before show time.
- Click that link. The Movie TeleParty page will open. Log into Netflix (if not logged in already). At the top right of the browser frame check your "Extensions" list. Find the letters Tp in red. You may need to click on the letters.
- 4. The movie party should begin. You'll be watching it along with the rest of us. As it plays we can chat on the side of the screen and make silly, snarky comments.

Free Movie Night was made for Reason Center members, but non-members are welcome too. RC *may* beg a small (voluntary) donation to cover costs. # > Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup

## Saturday, May 8, 2021, 9am - 11am

A tidy stretch of Highway 99 runs two miles from Elkhorn Boulevard to Elverta Road – *our* stretch. Sac-area freethinkers "adopted" it in July 1995. It's tidy because we have cared for it, nurtured it, rescued it from litter and debris, and received recognition for our work. Our most successful civic effort, it proves freethinkers can serve the community.

So join us, please! Enjoy a morning commune with nature, and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise ultimately be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, degrading habitat, and leading to a slow death for many sea creatures.

As usual, the stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including comfortable, natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers. The cleanup takes a scant two hours. Please dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5, past the old Arena. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-&-ride lot or near it.

Sunday, May 30, 2021, 2pm – 4pm

Steve Hill, that jolly Satanist, is back to put some devil into us.

You remember Steve. Bit by a radioactive stand-up artist, he now uses comedic super powers to explore the hollow, despairing pantomime of current events, from "Lil' Nas X" to Myanmar.

Like real estate prices, where will they go? (Steve is an L.A. appraiser.) What of the George Floyd case? What's being done to mitigate the fallout of mass incarceration? (Steve is also a former corrections officer, a.k.a. prison guard.) Is QAnon in touch with

# > National Day of Reason

### Thursday, May 6, 2021

<u>National Day of Reason</u> is a secular celebration observed on the first Thursday in May. The purpose is to celebrate reason and to bring attention to the threat to religious liberty caused by the U.S. Government's increasing encroachment into the private religious lives of its citizens. It was a direct response to the National Day of Prayer—a day that violates the First Amendment of the U.S Constitution because it requires federal, state, and local governments to fund religious ceremonies on this day. ## Birthday of Science


#### Friday, May 28, 2021

The Birthday of Science marks the day Thales of Miletus (in 585 BCE) correctly predicted a solar eclipse. A better choice might be the discovery of fire or the wheel, but we don't know exactly when that happened, or who did it. We do know about Thales. He was significant because the idea of cause and effect (causality) applies to all science. Given any phenomenon, with the exception of purely random quantum events, in principle we can trace its cause or causes, and the cause of those causes, back through time – until all cause-tracks merge at the "Big Bang," beyond which, presumably, no tracks remain. The seeds of our life and future were sewn then.

Science desires a beginning that applies to the big picture, and a sense of order and predictability. That is where causality leads us.
