- 1. Open your web browser right now and install the Netflix Tele party Extension. Get it at: https://www.netflixparty.com/. (Really, do it *now*, don't wait till movie night!)
- 2. Just before 7pm, fire up the browser again and go to the very special Netflix Movie TeleParty link, which will appear on the AOF events calendar about a half hour before showtime.
- 3. Click that link. The Movie TeleParty page will open. Log into Netflix (if not logged in already). At the top right of the browser frame check your "Extensions" list. Find the letters Tp in red. You may need to click on the letters.
- 4. The movie party should begin. You'll be watching it along with the rest of us. As it plays we can chat on the side of the screen and make silly, snarky comments.

➤ Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup

A tidy stretch of Highway 99 runs two miles from Elkhorn Boulevard to Elverta Road -- *our* stretch! Sac-area freethinkers "adopted" it in July 1995. It's tidy because we have cared for it, nurtured it, lovingly rescued it from litter and debris, and received recognition for our work. One of our more successful civic efforts, it proves freethinkers can also serve the community.

So please join us! Enjoy a morning commune with nature, and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise ultimately be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, leading to a slow death for many sea creatures. And Cal-Trans will pay AOF a stipend.

The stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers.

The cleanup takes a scant two hours. Please dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5, past the location of the old Sleeptrain Arena. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-k-ride lot if possible, or somewhere near it.

This is a great event for older children, but please leave smalls safe at home.

> "Bob" - Robert Ingersoll Speaks

Take two on this event: <u>Sean O'Brien</u>, performance artist and drama maven, will regale us with a revised take on the life of <u>Robert Green Ingersoll</u>. Previously planned for March, then cancelled due to venue problems, AOF now hopes to bring this one-man show to you at last this month.



You know Robert Ingersoll, of course. "Bob" was the most eloquent 19th Century freethinker, America's top orator in a day when public speaking was a bog of mediocrity wherein carbon minds floated in a syrupy sluice of their own making. In





other words, he was the envoy, the radical, the bleeding edge of freethought; and he often bled for it. You won't want to miss this one-man show. So mark your calendar. Meanwhile, our kind performer, Sean O'Brien, provides this background:

I chose "Bob" as the title of my show because Ingersoll was, in his time, warmly referenced by that appellation. And, apart from his agnosticism, he was well known for his dedication to "hearth and home" and the warmth of his family life was the single thing that so frustrated the clergy in their attempts to attack the man and not the idea, which has so often been the tack of religious bigotry and it's response to rational argument. At present, "Bob", is a compilation of Ingersoll's speeches from which I have edited what I believe are his most compelling arguments; however, I am working on expanding my one-man show into a much larger two act drama with multiple characters for the stage.

Since I retired from teaching and directing Theater Arts in secondary schools from New York City,, Virginia, Montana and California, I have focused on my own performance in local theaters, such as: Big Idea Theatre Company, the Sacramento and Davis Shakespeare Festivals, Chautauqua Theatre and The Art Theatre of Davis. I perform "The Portable Poe Show" in the public schools when they are open and "Bob" for regional humanist and free thought associations. I also have a singing and guitar act that I perform in Old Sacramento during tourist season and pubs when we are not in the throes of a pandemic.

➤ National Day of Reason Thursday, May 5, 2022

First endorsed first in 2003 and honored by U.S. secularists, the **National Day of Reason** (NDoR) occurs on the first



Thursday of May. NDoR is a response and counterbalance to the National Day of Prayer, designated by the US Congress since 1952. On this day all humanist Americans can join hands to celebrate rationality—a concept all should support. The goal: to raise public awareness of the persistent threat to religious liberty posed by government intrusion into the sphere of private worship. On January 23, 1808, in a letter to the Reverend Samuel Miller, Founding Father Thomas Jefferson had these words:

"Fasting and prayer are religious exercises; the enjoining them an act of discipline. Every religious society has a right to determine for itself the time for these exercises, and the objects proper for them, according to their own particular tenets; and right can never be safer than in their hands, where the Constitution has deposited it. ...civil powers alone have been given to the President of the United States and *no authority to direct the religious exercises of his constituents*." [emphasis added]

The National Day of Reason, a movable secular holiday, can occur any time from May 1 to May 7.

> Towel Day Wednesday, May 25, 2022

<u>Towel Day</u> is the annual celebration of the life and writings of Douglas Adams (1952-2001), humorist, humanist, conservationist, science fiction writer, and social critic. On that day, fans around the universe proudly carry a towel in his honor. Why a towel? Don't panic, go to the website to see - or better yet, read *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy*. It's a great book.



> Opposite Day Thursday, May 26, 2022

Some say the proper date is May 26, some say April 30, some say March 27th -- can you ever be sure? When someone says "Today is **Opposite Day**," he might be



lying! Opposite Day is a day to say the reverse of what you mean, with a wink, with a nod; a day when "no" means "yes" and "shut up" means "keep talking;" a day to be nice to your boss, teacher or enemy, and a complete jerk to your best friend; a day to turn words on their head; a day to tie knots in logic. Celebrate with care. It might get you in trouble!

➤ Birthday of Science Saturday, May 28, 2022

The **Birthday of Science** marks the day Thales of Miletus (in 585 BCE) correctly predicted a solar eclipse. A better choice might be the discovery of fire or the wheel, but we don't know exactly when that happened, or who did it. We *do* know about Thales. His prediction was significant because the idea of cause and effect (causality) applies to all science. Given any phenomenon, with the exception of purely random quantum events, in principle we can trace its cause or causes, and the cause of those causes, back through time -- until all cause-tracks merge at the "Big Bang," beyond which, presumably, no tracks remain. The seeds of our life and future were sewn then. The <u>Large Hadron Collider</u> is an effort to re-create those first moments.



Science desires a beginning that applies to the big picture, and a sense of order and predictability. That is where causality leads us.



Family News:

Anna Mae Andrews, August 16, 1932 - January 28, 2022

We will miss "Animated Anna," outspoken Sacramento humanist, born on a cattle farm in Rutland, Illinois. Her surviving family includes daughters Glenda Smaage, Beth Smaage, son-in-law Peter Killian, grandchildren Roseann and Alex, great grandchildren Ben, Ivy and Evan, and many friends (and a couple not so friendly). Her sisters Joy Wentsel, Mary Lou Andrews and adopted-sister Jean Berry also survive Anna, whom they characterized as "different."

Anna enjoyed photography, travel to exotic places, preparing (and eating) ethnic foods, reading in bed (particularly biography), and garage sales. She furnished her home with other people's antiques, textiles, Persian rugs, and paintings by friends. Store-bought goods had no personality, she claimed.

She had been an elementary school teacher, a director of religious education, and a committee secretary in the California Senate. She was a volunteer in many non-profit organizations including Peace Action, UNICEF, and Unitarian Universalist Society of Sacramento, and worked on political campaigns.



Ms. Anna Mae Andrews jokingly stated that her tombstone should say she was "Animated." However, she has been cremated and her ashes serenely and gently dispensed. Having lived in Illinois, Georgia and California, and traveled extensively to Europe, Asia, South America, Canada and many of the National Parks of the United States, she wanted to end it in a cool, beautiful river. Friends and relatives may be breathing a sigh of relief. But will also miss her.

The Bristol Blasphemer

HE QUAKERS HAD THE SENSE to spring up in the 1640s, England's first ever period of religious toleration. This meant that if they wanted persecution and opposition as a sign of divine approval, they really had to push the boat out.

This presumably is what inspired James Nayler, one of the first Quaker leaders, to proclaim himself Christ. He was a Yorkshire farmer, and one day while he was out ploughing he got himself a calling. So he gave up his possessions and toured the country, telling everyone that if they had God's spirit they were equal to God.

His enchanting preaching and sumptuous hair got him a devoted following, largely of women.

Someone (God, apparently) told them that the Second Coming would be in 1656, which they got very excited about. But it got to October, and there was still no sign of it. So they finally realized that the answer had been under their noses all the time: James Nayler was Jesus!

He rode into Bristol on horseback, in the pouring rain, with the women laying their cloaks before him in the mud, singing, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Israel." All men are equal to God, but some are more equal than others. They were still singing as they were led into prison.

Surprisingly, the story doesn't end with an execution. Instead, Nayler was whipped through the streets, branded with a "B" for "blasphemer" and had a hole bored through his tongue. He was left in the stocks, where a friend stroked and kissed him and licked the hot brand. Another put up a sign saying: "This is the King of the Jews."

Later, Nayler wrote a letter from prison renouncing his folly. And announced that although he had previously rejected the other Quakers (in his temporary post as Judge of the Living and the Dead), he would now be reconciled with them. Which I'm sure was a great relief to them.
