To attend, you'll need a personal Netflix account + a laptop or desktop computer with the <u>Google Chrome</u> or <u>Microsoft</u> <u>Edge</u> web browser. If you have these, do as follows:

- 1. Open your Chrome web browser right now and install the Netflix TeleParty Extension. Get it at https://www.netflixparty.com/. (Please do it *now*, don't wait till movie night!)
- 2. Just before show time, fire up the Chrome browser again and go to the very special Netflix Movie TeleParty link, which will appear on the AOF events calendar about then.
- 3. Click that link. The Movie TeleParty page will open. Log into Netflix (if not logged in already). At the top right of the browser frame check your "Extensions" list. Find the letters **Tp** in red. You may need to click on the letters.
- 4. The Netflix movie party should begin. You'll be watching it along with the rest of us. As it plays we can chat on the side of the screen and make silly, snarky comments.

Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup

Saturday, Aug 27, 2022, 9:00 am - 11:00 am

A tidy stretch of Highway 99 runs two miles from Elkhorn Boulevard to Elverta Road -- *our* stretch! Sac-area freethinkers "adopted" it in July 1995. It is tidy because we have cared for it, nurtured it, lovingly rescued it from litter and debris, and received recognition for our work. One of our more successful civic efforts, it proves freethinkers can also serve the community.

So please join us! Enjoy a morning commune with nature and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise ultimately be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, degrading habitat, and leading to a slow death for many sea creatures. And Cal-Trans is now paying AOF a stipend for our work.

ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY ATHEISTS & OTHER FREETHINKERS

As usual, the stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including

comfortable, natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers. The cleanup takes a scant two hours. Dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-&-ride lot if possible, or somewhere near it.

World Friendship Day

Humans are social creatures, recognizing the value of friendship, the invisible thread connecting our hearts. In 1935 the US Congress proclaimed World Friendship Day as a time to celebrate this humanist sentiment.

Other nations across the world soon adopted the noble idea of Friendship Day, honoring it on the first Sunday of August every year, making it a true international celebration.

How to acknowledge Friendship Day? Call on your friends, invite them for

food, embrace them, exchange cards and flowers, gift them with a <u>friendship band or bracelet</u>, or mark the day with programs celebrating human camaraderie.

Note, some groups and nations celebrate Friendship at other times of the year, with different customs and different emphasis. For instance:

- National Friendship Day is the first Sunday in August
- Women's Friendship Day, the third Sunday in August
- International Friendship Month is February
- Old Friends / New Friends Week is the third week of May

Ingersoll Day Thursday, August 11, 2022



Ingersoll Day marks the birthday of <u>Robert Green Ingersoll</u>, honoring the life and work of one of the most noted freethinkers in US history. Ingersoll was also the most successful orator in nineteenth century America, heard by more Americans than any human before the advent of motion pictures and radio. A leading political figure, he campaigned against slavery and for the rights of women and minorities. They called him the "Great Agnostic." He attracted huge crowds to lectures that criticized religion and promoted freethought. Walt Whitman and Mark Twain greatly admired him.

Celebrate Ingersoll Day with a visit to <u>the Robert Green Ingersoll</u> <u>Birthplace Museum</u>, or by reading excerpts from <u>the Complete Works of</u> <u>Ingersoll</u>.



"When I became convinced that the universe is natural, that all the ghosts and gods are myths, there entered into my brain, into my soul, into every drop of my blood the sense, the feeling, the joy of freedom. The walls of my prison crumbled and fell. The dungeon was flooded with light and all the bolts and bars and manacles became dust. I was no longer a servant, a serf, or a slave. There was for me no master in all the wide world, not even in infinite space. 

The Bathwater Messiah

HEN GOD CLOSES A DOOR, they say, he opens a window. I don't know what this means, but it seems to have worked for <u>Tanchelm of Antwerp</u>, who had to try various openings, failing as a monk and as a diplomat, before finding his niche as the most successful cult leader of the 12th century.

He toured the Netherlands denouncing the official Church to anyone who would listen. And because he did it rather well, they listened in their thousands.

"You might as well go to a brothel as go to these churches," he cried. Soon they were boycotting the church *en masse*. Probably some of them kept going to church and just started visiting brothels as well, but I'm guessing.

He preached to his adoring public in the fields. The similarity to John Wesley became less marked when the fame went to his head a little bit, and he announced that he was the incarnation of the Holy Spirit, a second Christ, and, yes, God himself.

Just when you thought that pretty much covered all the options, he also publicly married the Virgin Mary. He had all crucifixes replaced with his own banner. He told his followers that they were the only true Church, and that they should give him fantastic amounts of money, which they did, apparently as a wedding gift for him and the Perpetual Virgin.

But his best moment came when he started distributing his bathwater among the flock. He told them to drink it as a replacement for the eucharist. Whether he managed to transubstantiate it is not recorded.

At the height of his popularity, no unbeliever could get near him without being knifed by his bodyguards. In the end, though, he was killed by a local priest – but only after he had lost most of his followers to a newcomer, <u>St. Norbert of Xanten</u>, who did miracles and also talked to the animals.
