➤ Adopt-a-Highway Cleanup Saturday, May 13, 2023, 9am - 11am

A tidy stretch of Highway 99 runs two miles from Elkhorn Boulevard to Elverta Road -- *our* stretch! Sac-area freethinkers "adopted" it in July 1995. It's tidy because we have cared for it, nurtured it, lovingly rescued it from litter and debris, and received recognition for our work. One of our more successful civic efforts, it proves freethinkers can serve the community.

So join us! Enjoy a morning commune with nature, and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, degrading habitat,

and leading to a slow death for many sea creatures. (Note, Cal-Trans is now paying a stipend for our work!)



As usual, the stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including comfortable, natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers. The cleanup takes a scant two hours. Please dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5 past the Natomas area. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-&-ride lot if possible, or somewhere near it.

It's a great event for older children, but please leave smalls safe at home.



♦ Secular Holidays ♦ ♦

➤ National Day of Reason Thursday, May 4, 2023

First endorsed in 2003 and honored by U.S. secularists, the <u>National</u> **Day of Reason** (NDoR) occurs on the first Thursday of May. NDoR is a



response and counterbalance to the National Day of Prayer, designated by the US Congress since 1952. On this day all humanist Americans can join hands to celebrate rational thinking—a concept all can or should support. The goal: to raise public awareness of the persistent threat to religious liberty posed by government intrusion into the sphere of private worship. On January 23, 1808, in a letter to the Reverend Samuel Miller, our Founding Father Thomas Jefferson had these words

"Fasting and prayer are religious exercises; the enjoining them an act of discipline. Every religious society has a right to determine for itself the time for these exercises, and the objects proper for them, according to their own particular tenets; and right can never be safer than in their hands, where the Constitution has deposited it. ...civil powers alone have been given to the President of the United States and *no authority to direct the religious exercises of his constituents*." [emphasis added]

The National Day of Reason is a movable secular holiday – it can occur any time from May 1 to May 7. This year, the 4th.

> Towel Day

Thursday, May 25, 2023

<u>Towel Day</u> is the annual celebration of the life and writings of Douglas Adams (1952-2001), humorist, humanist, conservationist, science fiction writer, and social critic. On that day, fans around the universe proudly carry a towel in his honor. Why a towel? Don't panic, go to the website to see - or better yet, read <u>The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy</u>. It's a great book.



➤ Opposite Day Friday, May 26, 2023

Some say the proper date is May 26, some say April 30, some say March 27th -- can you ever be sure? When someone says "Today is **Opposite Day**," he might be lying! Opposite Day is a day to say the reverse of what you mean, with a wink, with a nod; a day when "no" means "yes" and "shut up" means "keep talking;" a day to be nice to your boss, teacher or enemy, and a complete jerk to your best friend; a day to turn words on their head; a day to tie knots in logic. Celebrate this day with care. It might get you in trouble!



➤ Birthday of Science Sunday, May 28 2023

The **Birthday of Science** marks the day Thales of Miletus (in 585 BCE) correctly predicted a solar eclipse. A better choice might be the discovery of fire or the wheel, but we don't know exactly when that happened or who did it. We *do* know about Thales. His prediction was significant because the idea of cause and effect (causality) applies to all science. Given any phenomenon, with the exception of purely random quantum events, in principle we can trace its cause or causes, and the cause of those causes, back through time -- until all cause-tracks merge at the "Big Bang," beyond which, presumably, no tracks remain. The seeds of our life and future were sewn then. The <u>Large Hadron</u> Collider is an effort to re-create those first moments.



Science desires a beginning that applies to the big picture, and a sense of order and predictability. That is where causality leads us.

Hug an Atheist Day

Thursday, June 1, 2023

In 2009, freethinker William Bermudez started <u>Hug an Atheist Day</u> (June 1st) to poke fun at other groups popping up at the time to encouraged hugging. He called for people to run up and hug atheists or nonbelievers in general. As one blogger wrote:

It doesn't matter what your worldview is, practice a little tolerance. Find your nearest Atheist, Absurdist, Agnostic, Anti-Religionist, Antitheist, Apatheist, Deist, Dystheist, Existentialist, Freethinker, Gropaga, Ignostic, Mahayana, Marxist, Misotheist, Naturalistic Pantheist, Nihilist, Nontheist, Pastafarian, Secular Humanist, Skeptic, Spagnostic, Structuralist, Buddhist, Zen Buddhist, or anyone else who doubts the existence of a god, and & give him/her the biggest hug ever!



But use common sense, because, you know, not everyone appreciates uninvited hugs.

St Aelhaiarn, the Snooping Saint

any saints make their name by being killed, of course. Torn on racks, burned in pitch, choked with quicklime, covered in nails, beheaded and drowned – and that was just St Quintin of Rome.

But St Aelhaiarn is (so far we know) unique among the blessed in having been killed as a punishment from God.

Aelhaiarn, or "Ironbrow" in English, was, according to that most reliable of historical records, medieval hagiography, the manservant of the great Welsh saint, Beuno of Clenogvaur.

Beuno was in the habit of rising secretly in the middle of the night and walking to Llaynhayrne, which as you'll appreciate is a four-mile trip from Clenogvaur. At Llaynhayrne he would kneel on a flat stone in the middle of the river and pray.

Aelhaiarn couldn't help wondering what the holy man was getting up to. So one night, in idle curiosity, he followed surreptitiously behind.

And so it was that in mid-prayer Beuno heard a rustle in the bushes and saw the shape of a man. Not knowing who was there, Beuno called on God to punish the lurker if his intentions were not commendable. Idle curiosity being non-commendable, the Lord rustled up a pack of wild beasts, who tore the hapless lackey limb from limb, and bit of limb from bit of limb.

Realising then who the lurker was, Beuno repented – a bit late, you might have thought. But not so. Nothing as superficial as dismemberment keeps a good saint down.

Beuno had the theology. He could rebuild him.

Bit by bit and limb by limb, he pieced his servant together. Unfortunately, though, in the darkness, even the great Beuno failed to find one of his eyebrows.

There was nothing for it but to fill the gap with the metal tip of his pikestaff. So the six-million-groat man went through life with an iron eyebrow – and that's how Aelhaiarn got his name.
