➤ Board of Directors Meeting

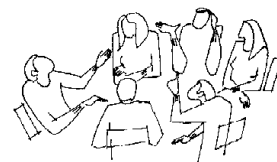

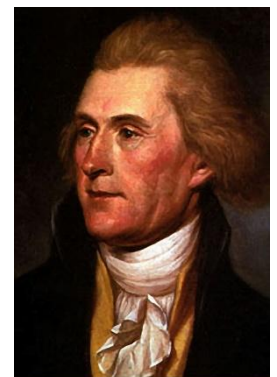

➤ Religious Freedom Day

Thursday, Jan 16, 2020

In the truest sense, [National Religious Freedom Day](#) is both a religious *and* a secular holiday. It marks the anniversary of the passage of the Virginia [Statute of Religious Freedom](#), the 1786 colonial statute that disestablished the Anglican Church in Virginia and set the foundation for Separation of Church and State. Thomas Jefferson marked this statute as one of his greatest achievements. Among other things it declared the following:

- "that to compel a man to furnish contributions of money for the propagation of opinions which he disbelieves is sinful and tyrannical,
- "that our civil rights have no dependence on our religious opinions any more than our opinions in physics or geometry,
- "that no man shall be compelled to frequent or support any religious worship, place, or ministry whatsoever, nor shall be enforced, restrained, molested, or burthened in his body or goods, nor shall otherwise suffer on account of his religious opinions or belief, but that all men shall be free to profess, and by argument to maintain, their opinions in matters of Religion, and that the same shall in no wise diminish, enlarge or affect their civil capacities."



Congress first marked Religious Freedom Day in 1993. It is a day to reflect on the hard-won separation of civic and religious life, and to refresh our resolve to inform fellow citizen about liberty of conscience in matters of faith, a liberty which must include both freedom *of* and *from* religion. Because otherwise, it is no freedom at all.

➤ Thomas Paine Day

Wednesday, January 29, 2020

[Thomas Paine Day](#), also called Freethinkers Day, promotes appreciation of freethought through the life and works of American patriot Thomas Paine. Paine (1737-1809) was a freethinker whose life and work inspired great social and political advancement across world. Raised in England, Paine played a vital role in the American and French Revolutions. His books and pamphlets, including *The Age of Reason*, *The Rights of Man*, and *Common Sense*, gained a mass audience for the liberating philosophy of the Enlightenment.



Paine arrived in America in 1774 at Benjamin Franklin's request. On January 10, 1776, he published *Common Sense*, a powerful republican pamphlet which had an immediate success. He served in the Revolutionary War under General Greene and later in official positions appointed by congress and in the Pennsylvania legislature. In his later publication, *Age of Reason*, Paine expressed that "all religions are in their nature mild and benign" when not associated with political systems. Paine was the quintessential Deist of the 18th century. He was among the first to call for an end to slavery and the establishment of human rights around the world.

In the 1990s, the *Truth Seeker* magazine began celebrating Freethinkers Day on Thomas Paine's birthday in order to educate the public on the importance of Thomas Paine in the history of freedom. It's poetic description of the day, on [this webpage](#), is worthy to repeat:

This day honors Thomas Paine and is on his birthday, January 29. This is a global holiday and is simply celebrated by giving and displaying a White Rose with Thorns. The simple beauty and purity, the fragility and yet not without the danger of drawing blood by a thorn prick, makes this an excellent icon for those Freethinkers who want to reflect on Freedom and promote the ideas of personal liberty as expressed by Paine in The Declaration of Independence,

This is a holiday that celebrates the concept of Freedom by honoring the man who declared our Independence by giving us Common Sense and The Declaration. We owe a great debt of gratitude to Thomas Paine.

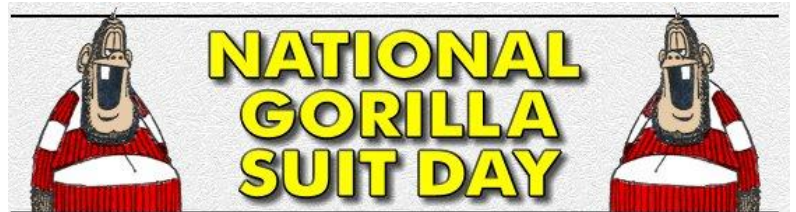
So you are welcome to celebrate with us. Just remember a White Rose with Thorns.

Also in the 1990s, the Thomas Paine Foundation began celebrating the birthday of Thomas Paine on January 29th, a Thomas Paine Day proclamation on June 8 and other Paine theme events during the year.

➤ Gorilla Suit Day

Friday, January 31, 2020

From the sublime to the ridiculous! Close on the heels of Thomas Paine day comes [National Gorilla Suit Day](#), a holiday invented by famed Mad Magazine cartoonist [Don Martin](#). The effluvia of controversy continues to surround this secular celebration: to some it is a



blatant conspiracy of gorilla suit manufacturers to promote their wares, others see it as one of America's more important and venerable holidays. Its origins lie in a 1963 comic strip. Don Martin aficionados later evolved the tradition that "NGSD" falls on the last day of January each year.

Whatever your opinion of NGSD, few deny the cartooning genius of Don Martin. Art historian Charles Taylor described Martin's unique style of art and wit:

His people are big-nosed schmoes with sleepy eyes, puffs of wiry hair, and what appear to be life preservers under the waistline of their clothes. Their hands make delicate little mincing gestures and their strangely thin, elongated feet take a 90-degree turn at the toes as they step forward. Whether they're average Joes or headhunters, Martin's people share the same physique: a tottering tower of obloids. Martin puts the bodies of these characters through every kind of permutation, treating them as much like gadgets as the squirting flowers and joy buzzers that populate his gags: glass eyes pop out from a pat on the back; heads are steamrollered into manhole-cover shapes. All of this accompanied by a Dadaist panoply of sound effects found nowhere else: *shtoin!* *shklorp!* *fwoba-dap!* It's unlikely Samuel Beckett was aware of Don Martin, but had he been he might have recognized a kindred spirit.



The Age of Reason by Thomas Paine

In *The Age of Reason*, first published in 1794, Thomas Paine uses many of the same arguments used by modern authors, such as Bart Ehrman, Richard Dawkins, Christopher Hitchens, Richard Carrier, to discredit the credibility of the Old and New Testaments. His explanation of Deism gives me a better understanding about its meaning.

In discussing the basis for Christianity, Paine points out that the Christian beliefs are to a large degree grounded in heathen mythology. He points to temporal incongruity in the Old Testament to discredit the notion that Moses was the author of the Books of Moses; many place names used in the books of Moses that did not exist for hundreds of years after Moses' death.

The Bible cannot be the word of God, because of the inconsistent and often misused translations of words between human languages that distorts meaning. For example, the Hebrew word "Alma," used in Genesis to infer the coming virgin birth of Christ, did not mean virgin, but "young woman of child-bearing age." Regarding Christ's virgin birth, Paine asks: "Would any girl that is now with child to say, and even swear to it, that she was gotten with child by a ghost, and that an angel told her so, would she be believed? Certainly she would not."

Paine questions the morality of a supposedly merciful god that would condone the mass killing of innocent men, women, and children.

He discredits the notion of revelation by pointing out that something is a revelation only for the person who experiences the revelation, to all others, its hearsay. He states: "When it is revealed to me, I will believe it to be revelation; . . . neither is it proper that I should take the word of man as the word of God and put man in the place of God."

With regard to the New Testament he understood that Matthew, Luke, Mark, and John were not the authors of the books of the New Testament and that they were written many years after the Christ's death. Given the way the Bible has been interpreted and reproduced made it openly susceptible to forgery.

He notes numerous inconsistencies in the books of the New Testament for example:

- Differing representations of Jesus' genealogy between Matthew and Luke,
- Different representation of the inscription of Jesus' cross by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, as well as different accounts of the time of day the crucifixion occurred.
- Matthew claims there was darkness over the land for three hours during the crucifixion, that there was an earthquake, and that graves opened. Neither Mark or Luke mention an earthquake or graves opening. John says nothing of darkness, earthquake, nor graves opening.
- The accounts of the resurrection are also inconsistent between the authors, and neither Matthew nor John even mention the ascension into heaven.

If the story of Herod ordering the massacre of all children under two years of age in the Gospel of Matthew was true, it certainly would be mentioned in historic texts. Likewise, if the sky would have gone dark for three hours during the day of the crucifixion, that would also have been noted in historic texts. Of course, neither were.

Turning to the discussion of Deism, Paine says "The most detestable wickedness, the most horrid cruelties, and the greatest miseries, that have afflicted the human race have had their origin in this thing called revelation, or revealed religion." So, "We should never force belief upon ourselves in any thing", and "The **creation** is the Bible of the Deist."; "We can know God only through his works", "... it is not our belief or disbelief that can make or unmake facts." It is only through the medium of science "... that man can see God, as it were, face to face."

With regard to separation of church and state, Paine stated: "Pure and simple deism does not answer the purpose of despotic governments. They cannot lay hold of religion as an engine but by mixing it with human inventions, and making their own authority a part; neither does it answer the avarice of priests, but by incorporating themselves and their functions with it, and becoming, like the government, a party in the system. It is this that forms the otherwise mysterious connection of church and state; the church human, and the state tyrannical."

The Age of Reason concludes on a rather optimistic note "... certain as I am that when opinions are free, either in matters of government or religion, truth will finally and powerfully prevail."

We can only hope, but we must keep church and state separate!
