

Reason Center Library:

A Black Humanists' Panel Spurs AOF to Expand Book Collection

At an Atheists & Other Freethinkers (AOF) meeting last year, a lively panel presentation by three representatives supplied by the Black Humanists and Nonbelievers group made quite an impression on the (mostly white) audience in attendance.

The panelists pointed out many of their personal trials growing up and living in the United States. Their stories exemplified so many of the challenges faced by African Americans (and Black people, period).

All in all, theirs was an enlightening narrative. So much so, in fact, that following the presentation, the AOF board asked the BHAN folks if they could recommend some reading materials so that more and more of our Reason Center members were better informed and could explore some of the highlighted issues in greater depth. The AOF board promised BHAN it would purchase some of the items and donate them to the Reason Center Library for general circulation.

Thanks to BHAN for suggesting about a dozen readings with descriptions (many from a humanist perspective). Thanks also to AOF, as the board voted to spend up to \$100 value, with each board member voting his/her "top 3" of prime interest. Mynga Futrell offered to match that amount, adding a personal \$100 to the pot.

Consequently, AOF has acquired and turned over seven books to Reason Center (a mix of paperback and hard cover). Once shelved, these books will be available for checking out, now only by AOFers, but by *any*one who is a Reason Center member. (If not yet a member, you can Join Reason Center now.)

Here are the seven titles (HC=hard cover; PB=paperback): Why We Can't Wait by Martin Luther King Jr. (PB) / The Color of Law by Richard Rothstein (HC) / Black Lives Matter at School: An Uprising for Educational Justice by editors Denisha Jones and Jesse Hagoplan (HC) / How to Raise an Antiracist by Ibram X. Kendi (HC) / Viral Justice: How We Grow the World We Want by Ruah Benjamin (HC) / Godless Americana: Race and Religious Rebels and Humanists in the Hood: Unapologetically black, Feminist, and Heretical, both by Sikivu Hutchinson (PB).

Whatever your racial identity, there is much to learn about "Being Black in America" folks! Lots of raw material to supply the inquiring minds of freethinkers of all stripes.

The Gradualism of Evolution

By Richard Dawkins – from Science, the Poetry of Reality, his keynote lecture at CSICon 2023

Life itself runs on a single, universal digital code: quaternary rather than binary, but otherwise exactly like computer information. Hindsight says it had to be so. Evolution wouldn't work without the high fidelity that digital genetics allows. Today we can read the DNA of any animal, of any species, in a matter of days or even hours. We can compare the DNA recipes that made a rat and you. By counting the discrepancies, we can estimate how many millions of years separate you and the rat from your shared ancestor.

"Wait! Shared ancestor? You mean I share an ancestor with a *rat*?" You certainly do. She was approximately your fifteen-million-greats grandmother, and she lived about seventy-five million years ago. By the way, here's a rather astonishing fact: there was a single individual female who was the fork in the road. She had two babies: two little siblings, playing in the dust. One playmate was our ancestor, plus that of all monkeys, apes, and lemurs. The other little playmate was the unknowing ancestor of rabbits, rats, porcupines, beavers, and capybaras. Also, by the way, giant extinct South American rodents. Imagine a guinea pig the size of a hippopotamus. And while we're on surprising facts, if you look far enough into the future, it must be the case that you, a particular individual sitting in this room, will either be the ancestor of everybody or of nobody. I'll just leave that with you and hurry on.

Philosophers of science love to say that present scientific knowledge is only an unfalsified approximation to a deeper truth. But have you noticed how often they rely on a single hackneyed example: Newtonian gravity as a workable approximation to general relativity. How many other examples fit the pattern? In my own field of evolutionary biology, we have facts that are not temporary, unfalsified approximations. They are just plain true. If you trace your great-grandparents and a chimpanzee's great-grandparents back sufficiently far, you will hit a common ancestor. That's not an approximation. It's a simple fact. It's just true.

Imagine you're standing in Las Vegas, holding the hand of your mother. She holds the hand of her mother, your grandmother. Your grandmother holds the hand of your great-grandmother, and so on in a chain. The chain extends in a southwesterly direction until it hits the Pacific at Santa Monica and can go no farther. Somewhere around the Mojave National Park, the hand-holders would be Homo erectus. By Bairstow in the middle of the desert, they'd look like Lucy, an Australopithecus. And eventually, on the beach at Santa Monica, staring at the Pacific with a wild surmise, would stand the common ancestor we share with chimpanzees.

Now, with her other hand, the matriarch by the Pacific grips the hand of a different daughter. That daughter holds the hand of her daughter. And so on. A parallel chain now wends its way back through the interminable streets of Los Angeles, across the desert to Las Vegas. The two chains of increasingly distant cousins face each other along the way. And by the time the chain of daughters reaches Las Vegas, we have modern chimpanzees, face to face with modern humans. These modern cousins facing each other belong, of course, in completely different species.

They cannot interbreed. Yet every step of the way along the chain of ancestors, round the hairpin bend at Santa Monica and back to Las Vegas, every individual is the same species as her neighbor. There is gradual change, so gradual as to be far below the threshold of perception.


