## > Brain Stuff: Cognitive Acquisition and Maintenance from Birth to Death

Sunday, May 18, 2025, 2 pm - 4 pm

A whole-life research model is behind this (non-medical) presentation on the brain. The model spans early-life "brain building" through late-life "cognition keeping." We will look at how some important nature/nurture factors of brain development, reserve, and plasticity come into play across a lifetime.

Let us be frank. As of now, you are simply stuck with whatever conditions of brain development came your way as a child, factoring in how well you've maintained supportive elements of cognition in adulthood so far. You may find your own brain occasionally letting you down, such as when you can't recall someone's name only five minutes after an introduction or know why you came into a room. Situations like that are likely not of any real consequence.



But we know about dreaded neurodegenerative diseases like Alzheimer's, don't we? (So now go back to sentence #1 above, and to the research model that deals with some key factors at play in both healthy brains and suffering brains.)

Our speaker, Mynga Futrell, is co-founder of AOF and The Brights (the-brights.net). Since 2001 she has been a volunteer on the Education and Programs/Services Committees of the regional Alzheimer's Association. Since 2019, she has taught a semester-long seminar on dementia at the CSUS Renaissance Society.

One of our successful civic efforts, it proves freethinkers can also serve the community.

So, join us! Enjoy a morning commune with nature, and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise ultimately be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, degrading habitat, and leading to a slow death for many sea creatures. Note, Cal-Trans is now paying a stipend for our work!

As usual, the stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including comfortable, natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers. The cleanup takes a scant two

hours. Please dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5 past the Natomas area. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-&-ride lot if possible, or somewhere near it.






### Blasphemy Breakfasts and a Brunch



## ➤ Towel Day Sunday, May 25, 2025

<u>Towel Day</u> is the annual celebration of the life and writings of Douglas Adams (1952-2001), humorist, humanist, conservationist, science fiction writer, and social critic. On that day, fans around the universe proudly carry a towel in his honor. Why a towel? Don't panic, go to the website to see - or better yet, read <u>The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy</u>. It's a great book.



## ➤ Opposite Day Monday, May 26, 2025

Some say the proper date is May 26, some say April 30, some say March 27th – can you ever be sure? When someone says "Today is **Opposite Day**," he might be lying! Opposite Day is a day to say the reverse of what you mean, with a wink, with a nod; a day when "no" means "yes" and "shut up" means



"keep talking;" a day to be nice to your boss, teacher or enemy, and a complete jerk to your best friend; a day to turn words on their head; a day to tie knots in logic. Celebrate with care. It might get you in trouble!

# ➤ Birthday of Science Wednesday, May 228, 2025

The **Birthday of Science** marks the day Thales of Miletus (in 585 BCE) correctly predicted a solar eclipse. A better choice might be the discovery of fire or the wheel, but we don't know exactly when that happened, or who did it. We *do* know about Thales. His prediction was significant because the idea of cause and effect (causality) applies to all science. Given any phenomenon, with the exception of purely random quantum events, in principle we can trace its cause or causes, and the cause of those causes, back through time -- until all cause-tracks merge at the "Big Bang," beyond which, presumably, no tracks remain. The seeds of our life and future were sewn then. The <u>Large Hadron Collider</u> is an effort to re-create those first moments.



Science desires a beginning that applies to the big picture, and a sense of order and predictability. That is where causality leads us.

## This Month in Religious History

May 4, 570 - The Kaaba, the black cube in the center of Mecca that was supposedly built by Abraham, attracted so many religious pilgrims that Christians were annoyed. They had two gripes—one, it was full of idols, and two, it kept people from their churches. So Abraha, the Abyssinian viceroy of Yemen, assembled an army in the spring of 570, and rode into Mecca threatening to destroy the Kaaba. The Meccans fled, but flocks of strange birds appeared in the sky and started dropping little stones on the Abyssinian army. Abraha and his army were infected with a deadly disease that caused Abraha's heart to burst and his fingers fall off one by one, and all his soldiers were "rendered like straw eaten up." Whatever the pox was, it was not pretty. The Kaaba abides.

May 6, 1844 - 3000 Protestants gathered in the Nanny Goat Market in Philadelphia to listen to anti-Catholic speeches. The Nanny Goat Market was in an Irish Catholic neighborhood, so Catholics eventually answered the day-long invective with musket fire. As Protestants darted among food stalls lining Cadwalader Street, an 18-year-old apprentice leather worker was mortally wounded and two other men were shot. Catholics 3, Protestants 0. No nanny goats were injured.

May 7, 1844 - Calling themselves "nativists"—people who think Catholic immigrants should go back to Europe where they belong—several thousand armed Protestants marched to the Kensington neighborhood of Philadelphia, seeking revenge for the murder of their co-religionist the previous day. But they were easy targets for Catholics bunkered in the houses on Cadwalader Street. The Irish Papists quickly laid down a steady stream of musket fire, killing a shoemaker, a ship carpenter, a marble mason and a rope maker, as well as wounding 11 others. The nativists then ignited the houses where the firing originated and, as the Irish families ran out, shot at them—missing. Militia companies arrived to restore order. The score was Catholics 17, Protestants 0.

May 11, 1825 - The American Tract Society was founded at 87 Nassau Street in New York, quickly becoming America's leading charity and distributing 35 million evangelical books and tracts in its first decade. The theory was that if we could wipe out vices like gambling, alcoholism and sexual license, all of which hinder conversion, then the nation would become Christian and the passions of the underclasses could be kept under control. The society, after 183 years of pamphleteering, is now based in Garland, Texas, and on the verge of finally eliminating every vice.

May 13, 1801 - The first reports of wild "camp meetings" in the Kentucky wilderness filtered back to the east coast, marking the start of the Second Great Awakening. Although the meetings were originally organized by Presbyterian ministers, they became so intense and emotional that they were eventually repudiated by the Presbyterians, then the Baptists. Only the Methodists continued to boogie down in the woods for the rest of the 19th century.

May 16, 1815 - In Philadelphia, Richard Allen and his black Methodist colleagues formed the African Methodist Episcopal Church, after all the black converts in the Second Great Awakening received a less than brotherly welcome from white Methodists. Allen had left the Methodists in 1787 after their initial enthusiasm for a color-blind church evaporated.

May 20, 1824 - Lorenzo Dow, a Methodist evangelist who traveled from town to town inspiring people to enthusiastic fits, introduced the Jerking Exercise, in which people would flail their arms about and let the Holy Spirit grab and shake them like bags of flour until they collapsed. It took som generations to refine the Exercise, which you can see on any stage where Benny Hinn appears.
