Climate change ... how much do you think about it? Pshaw, it's not enough.

Climate change is a weedy and polarizing topic. Some say we're doomed to climate catastrophe, while others say concerns are overblown and we should focus on expanding fossil fuel production in a bid for "energy dominance."

Dana Nuccitelli, our speaker, will dissect both sides and make a case that while climate changes pose an immense challenge, with the help of clean technologies, addressing the climate crisis while meeting our energy needs is entirely possible.

Who's <u>Dana Nuccitelli</u>? An environmental scientist with a bachelor's degree in astrophysics from UC Berkeley and a master's degree in physics from UC Davis. He is the Research Manager for the nonprofit climate advocacy group Citizens' Climate Lobby and a climate journalist who has written for Skeptical Science since 2010, for The Guardian from 2013 to 2018, and for Yale Climate Connections since 2018. Dana has also published 10 peer-reviewed climate papers, most notably on the 97% expert consensus among climate scientists that humans are primarily responsible for the observed global warming since 1950. What a guy.

> Adopt-A-Highway Cleanup

Out on Highway 99, for two miles from Elkhorn Boulevard to Elverta Road, runs a lonely stretch -- *our* stretch! Sac-area freethinkers "adopted" it in July 1995. We have cared for it, nurtured it, lovingly rescued it from litter and debris, and received recognition for our work. One of our successful civic efforts, it proves freethinkers can also serve the community.

So, join us! Enjoy a morning commune with nature, and do a deed for the environment and local area wildlife. The refuse we collect would otherwise ultimately be swept by the rain into tributaries and into the ocean, degrading habitat, and leading to a slow death for many sea creatures.



As usual, the stalwart activity captain will provide all safety equipment, including comfortable, natty hard-hats and gloves, stylish safety vests, collection bags, and handy trash pickers. The cleanup takes a scant two hours. Please dress for the season. It may be a good idea to bring a backpack or fanny-pack to carry 3 or 4 trash bags.

To get there, travel north from Sacramento on I-5 past the Natomas area. Take the "Highway 99 - Yuba City, Marysville" exit. Exit at Elkhorn Boulevard less than a mile north. Turn left, cross the overpass. Park in the park-&-ride lot if possible, or somewhere near it.



➤ Carl Sagan Day Sunday, November 9, 2025

Carl Sagan Day marks the birthday of the great Carl Sagan, and is a celebration to honor his memory. Carl Sagan was Professor of Astronomy and Space Science and Director of the Laboratory for Planetary Studies at Cornell University, an outspoken skeptic, humanist and freethinker, and a Pulitzer Prize winning science author. But for the most part the public remembers him as the creator of the Cosmos television series. This Emmy and Peabody award-winning PBS series transformed educational television when it first aired in 1980. Thirty years later it still seems fresh, and has gone on to affect the hearts and minds of over a billion people in sixty countries.



His *magnum opus* was his final book, <u>The Demon-Haunted World</u>, published in 1995, the year before his untimely death.

Few other science writers (perhaps only Isaac Asimov) were able to reach and teach so many nonscientists in such a meaningful way. So, in 2009, the <u>Center for Inquiry</u> inaugurated Carl Sagan Day as a secular holiday. Each year we will continue to celebrate Dr. Sagan, remember him and his work, and revel in the wondrous cosmos he helped us understand.


➤ Church/State Separation Week Sunday, November 23, 2025 - Saturday, November 29, 2025

Many freethinkers have adopted the week of Thanksgiving (~November 24) as **Church/State Separation Week**, to offer concerned and active citizens an opportunity to educate others about the importance of a clear division between Church and State. The hope is that this secular holiday will rally us and provide a platform to celebrate one of this nation's finest contributions to civilization.

Secularist societies such as <u>Americans United for the Separation of Church and State</u>, the <u>Institute for First Amendment Studies</u>, the <u>Freedom From Religion Foundation</u>, the <u>American Atheists</u> and the <u>Institute for the Secularization of Islamic Society</u>, as well as others united for a secular government, have supported this celebration.



In humanist circles, some also celebrate November 24 as <u>Evolution Day</u>, marking as it does the anniversary of the first publication of *The Origin of Species* (Nov 24, 1859). For the most, however, the focus is on church/state separation this week. Carles Darwin has his own secular holiday (see: February 12).

Most Christians have no idea where their own religion came from

One of those social media preacher kids came up to me on the street recently. The kind with a backward hat, a ring light, and a mic in your face asking if you believe in Jesus. I said no. He looked stunned. Then I asked him a few basic questions about his own religion. It fell apart instantly.

He didn't know that Paul never met Jesus. He didn't know that Paul's letters were written before the Gospels. He had no idea the Gospels were written decades after Jesus died, by anonymous Greek authors who weren't eyewitnesses. No clue that Matthew and Luke copied from Mark. No idea the resurrection stories contradict each other completely. He had never heard that the earliest Gospel, Mark, ends with no resurrection appearances at all.

He couldn't explain why Jesus's birth is dated to two completely different time periods in Matthew and Luke. One says it happened under Herod, who died in 4 BCE. The other says it was during the census under Quirinius in 6 CE. That's a tenyear gap. One Gospel has Jesus's family fleeing to Egypt. The other says they went straight back to Nazareth.

And when I brought up the Trinity, he said it's all over Scripture. I asked him to show me where Jesus defines it. He couldn't. Because he didn't know the Trinity is a post-biblical doctrine created by Church councils in the fourth century. Same with the New Testament canon. He didn't realize it was the Catholic Church that decided which books made it into the Bible. Evangelicals claim they just follow Scripture, but they're following a table of contents that Rome gave them.

Most Christians have no idea that Paul barely talks about Jesus's life, teachings, or miracles that Judas dies two different ways in Matthew and Acts that the Gospels can't agree on who found the tomb, who was there, or what they saw that John rewrites everything with a totally different voice and message that the last twelve verses of Mark were added later that doctrines like the Trinity, the virgin birth, and parts of the resurrection story evolved over time

But they'll still tell you you're going to hell for not believing it.

If you're going to preach to strangers on the sidewalk, maybe start by understanding where the magical sacred book came from. I seriously think the majority of Christians think "Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John" watched Jesus go around and then got together right after he died and wrote down everything exactly as it happened. They obviously just cherrypick feel good verses and have never actually read and compared all the wild contradictions haha. Jesus can be whatever you want him to be.... That is what the writers of the gospels and Paul did!


Sleeping Preachers (from ShipOfFools.com)

THERE IS NOTHING UNUSUAL, of course, about sleeping during a sermon. Unless it's your own. That takes rather more of a gift.

There are a surprising number of people who have had the ability to preach in their sleep, usually ones who were not allowed to preach when awake.

Helena Konttinen, for example, was a poor Finnish woman who started sleeppreaching in 1905, reading her sermons from books held for her by angels in her dreams. She went on for up to five hours, and suffered three attempts on her life. I'm not suggesting those two facts are related.

Ninety years earlier, Rachel Baker, a cloakmaker, was doing the same kind of thing in upstate New York. She would start punctually at 9pm with spasms and



One of John Wesley's preachers performed in his sleep as well as during the day. One of the odder stories in Wesley's Journal, this is an account of one of his preachers who gave sermons in his sleep. He would start in the early hours of the morning with a hymn, tell his congregation to pay attention, and then pontificate. Instead of scripture-bearing angels, he had hecklers coming to him in his dreams, and had to interrupt his sermon to argue with them.

And for those who don't have the gift of preaching sermons in their sleep, there's always the possibility of hearing them instead. John Newton had a lodger who heard a different sermon from a different person every night, and then recounted them at breakfast. "But when she married, she lost her gift."
